## This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Rev. Chuck Ellestad, Hospice Chaplain. He stated that this is the best job he has had; he loves working with staff and families in his job. Hospice was started by Dame Cicely Saunders 50 years ago in England. The goal of Hospice is to provide the highest quality of care in the last stages of life in a setting of the patient's choosing. Hospice of the Bluegrass is 30 years old and serves 30 counties in this area. 3,500 patients were served last year and over 4,000 families. There are 500 full-time employees. Hospice also provides "extra care" where private persons serve patients and their families. There is also a large group of volunteers who provide companionship if nothing else. He also listed several misunderstandings of Hospice. First, it is not true that Hospice helps only when there is nothing else that can be done for the patient. Anyone struggling with a long-term illness may contact Hospice, which provides palliative rather than curative care. This means that Hospice manages things like pain and stress. Often when the patient feels better he or she gets better. Hospice responds to your requests and you tell us what you

want us to do. Examples of this can vary from having toenails clipped to taking a pet to the vet. Hospice sees to the well-being of the patient, who may not always be at the last step of an illness. Sometimes the patient's quality of life dramatically improves. A second myth is that Hospice is only for cancer patients. In fact, less than half have this diagnosis. The procedure is for a doctor to refer a patient, and states that the end of life "may" occur in six months or less. However, Hospice never assumes death will occur within six months. Hospice will stay with a patient as long as there is a disease, although there is reevaluation done every 60 days. Finally, it is a myth that care must be provided in a home setting. Although most stay at home, care is also provided to persons in hospitals, nursing homes, and even to homeless persons. Advanced planning is also done. There is a bereavement service which is provided free of charge. The families will often be assigned a bereavement counselor. While Hospice cannot promise to add days to one's life, it can promise to add life to one's days. In responding to questions he stated that to be present at a patient's passing is one of the most precious gifts of all. It is a privilege to be present at the threshold of eternity. Persons interested in general support groups should contact the Grief Center in Lexington. Finally, he stated that Dame Saunders was instrumental in bringing Hospice to this country and Hospice care is reimbursed through Medicare. Hospice is cost efficient and is the recipient of generous donations.
