**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Sharon Marcum, who works as an independent consultant providing facilitation services in areas such as strategic planning, process improvement and team development. She spoke about the Bluegrass Alliance for Women, which has as its core values the belief in the kinship, spirit, and strength of women, lifelong learning through shared experiences and hands-on projects that empower women and girls, diversity of thought, culture and experience, committed to a culture of trust, respect, open communication and collaboration. The goals are measurable progress in improving the lives of women and girls, effective collaboration and partnerships, recognized leader and visible resource, diverse community of support and sustainable organization. The mission of the Alliance is to create opportunities within

the Bluegrass Region that empower women and girls in the areas of leadership, education, health and well-being, equity and economic sufficiency. This is a grass-roots organization, which is all-volunteer and non-partisan, covering 17 counties in the Bluegrass. The projects of the Alliance address women's issues and the economic status of women, which grew out of a task force. Unfortunately, Kentucky is near the bottom in the welfare of women and dead last in political participation. The Alliance has workshops that help women find the resources they need. The Alliance helps women increase their knowledge and skills, and finds people to give of their time and talent to help others. These workshops help women learn about budgetary skills and retirement as well as financial management. They are also targeting people to teach the workshops in Spanish, since 30% of the women are Hispanic. The Alliance pairs women up with mentors as for example women who have held public office. There are mother/daughter career development workshops. The Alliance is celebrating Women's History month and gives Legacy Awards. For example, Jill Robinson and Ronnie Dunn have won these awards. It is not just women but men also act as volunteers to teach important life skills. The Alliance partners with many organizations to help women learn important financial skills and she invited the Rotary Club to also be an invaluable partner with the Alliance.
