Next Week's Program...

Judge Combs is currently serving her 15th year on the Kentucky Court of Appeals for the First Division of the 7th Judicial District. Born in Louisville, Kentucky, Judge Combs resides in Powell County at her farm, Fern Hill, where she and her late husband, the well-known and beloved former Governor Bert T. Combs, made their home. An Eastern Kentuckian by choice, "Sara," as she is most commonly called, shares the beauty and serenity of her log home in the mountains with numerous visitors who enjoy the hospitality equated with Fern Hill. Her background is filled with academic excellence: valedictorian at both Sacred Heart Academy in Louisville and the University of Louisville where she obtained a B.A. in French, she was recipient of a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship and achieved the rank of second in her class at U of L Law School. Both the College of Arts and Sciences and the Law School of the University of Louisville honored Judge Combs by naming her among their Distinguished Alumni. Judge Combs' professional experience includes teaching at both the high school and university levels as well as the practice of law. She has brought a diverse range of training and experience to

the bench. She has also made history in a series of firsts. Sara was the Commonwealth's first woman to serve on the Supreme Court. She was elected the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals in 2004, was the first woman to serve as Chief of an appellate court in Kentucky, and was the first Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals from the mountains of Eastern Kentucky. Judge Combs is affiliated with numerous professional organizations and institutions of higher learning. She has been active for many years as a volunteer speaker for countless professional, civic, and youth organizations.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Rusty Chevront. Director of Global Community Relations for Brown-Forman. He stated that his business is changing and evolving, and that his company's motto is "Best Brand Builders in the Industry". He listed many of the brands sold by his company, beginning with Jack Daniels – one of the most valuable trademarks in the world. Brown-Forman has 4,000 total employees which is about 50/50 domestic and global. The company was founded in 1870 but had certain quality control issues when it began selling Old Forester. The company started sealing the bottles right at the distillery. They sold to doctors during Prohibition for medicinal purposes. In 1940, Brown-Forman bought Lebrout and Graham (now Woodford Reserve). The Louisville distillery today is off Crittenden Drive near the airport. In 1956, the company bought Jack Daniels in Lynchburg, Tennessee and Owsley Brown took the company globally. Early Times was purchased in 1923. Today, Woodford Reserve is the most popular small brand name and is the official bourbon of the Kentucky Derby. Other brands owned by Brown-Forman include Southern Comfort, Canadian Mist, and Finlandia Vodka, which is the largest imported vodka by Russia and Poland. Brown-Forman also owns various vineyards on the Pacific coast.
