This Week's Speaker...

Paula Rutledge, who has been director of the Franklin County Red Cross Chapter for 15 years, discussed the services of, and volunteer opportunities with, the Red Cross. The Franklin County Chapter was chartered in 1917 and serves the people of Franklin, Woodford, and (unofficially) Anderson Counties. The Red Cross is supported primarily by donated funds, with 60% of its revenue coming from the United Way. It charges fees for health and safety services, but provides scholarships for those who cannot afford the training. The Red Cross, nationwide, is primarily staffed by

volunteers, with the average ratio of 27 volunteers for each paid staff person (typically three). Red Cross programs include disaster relief and services to the armed forces, both of which are 24-hour programs. Volunteers are on call around the clock when a disaster strikes. Volunteers equipped with pagers provide emergency communications for military service people. The disaster relief and community education program includes disaster preparedness training through civic groups, churches, and schools. Paula brought some samples of emergency preparedness kits. In response to a question, she said the kits can be purchased from the Red Cross and the proceeds benefit the organization. Other programs include blood collection, including a regular donation opportunity at the Chapter house on Fridays from 9 am to 2 pm. and health and safety training, e.g., CPR, aquatic safety, babysitter training. Each Red Cross Chapter has community and youth services tailored to its community. Franklin County's includes hospital volunteers, talking books, and nursing home volunteers. Paula noted that Frankfort Red Cross volunteers have been and are currently deployed to other parts of the state and country for disaster response. She described disaster response training as "painless" and encouraged Rotarians to be involved as volunteers. In response to questions, Paula said that the Red Cross is unique in having a network to bring blood in from across the nation. There is no charge for blood, per se, but there are processing fees to cover blood bags, testing, refrigeration, etc. Insurance usually pays those fees. There are 27 Red Cross chapters in Kentucky. Every county does not have a chapter; but every county is covered, to some extent, by a chapter. In Paula's honor, the Club is donating the book Hurricanes and Tornadoes to Bondurant Middle School Library.
