It is that time of year when we sign-up to ring the bell for the Salvation Army. This year's bell-ringing is set for Saturday, December 20 from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. at the following locations: Kroger East (two locations), Kroger West, Wal-Mart (two locations) and K-Mart. We will be ringing for two hours. To sign up see Joe Johnson beside the registration desk.

This Week's Program...

The speaker for the day was District Governor Terry Shockley who spoke about his visits to all the clubs in the District, ranging in size from ten to 500. The thing all these clubs have in common is that they are all making a difference in their communities, and he asked what the world would look like if there was no Rotary. For one thing, there would be 1,000 more cases of polio each day attacking the world's children. There would not be 37,000 Ambassadorial Scholars in 100 countries, there would not be 60 Peace Scholars, there would not be 60,000 group study exchange members in 500 teams, there would not be 24,000 matching grants in 170 countries, there would not be District Simplified grants, and finally we would not have club projects. This club has numerous club projects such as the Salvation Army bell-ringing, youth scholarships, international projects and Interact clubs to name a few. Multiply this by 33,000 clubs and you can see what a difference Rotary is making. D.K. Lee of Korea is the International President and has adopted the theme "Make Dreams Real". It is unbelievable that 30,000 children under age five die around the world each day. The Rotary Club has 1.2 million members in 200 countries, 532 districts and 33,000 clubs. District 6710, of which we are a part, has 3400 members in 59 clubs. In eleven areas, there are Assistant District Governors and Assistant Governor Coordinators helping the clubs of the District. Although eradicating polio is a priority goal, Rotary International also emphasizes clean water, health, hunger, literacy, Family of Rotary and reducing child mortality. There are many areas of emphasis but the most important one is on children. The District Priority Goals are as follows: (1) Finish the promise to make this a polio-free world; (2) Increase the membership of Rotary; (3) Improve the lives of children and reduce childhood mortality; (4) Meet the annual fund goal of \$200,000; (5) Support leadership development The aim

is to have a 10% net growth per club; (6) Support the \$100,000,000 challenge grant. The Bill Gates Foundation has given \$100,000 to Rotary and has issued a challenge to Rotary to raise another \$100,000,000 by December 2010. \$40,000,000 from the Gates Foundation has gone to immunizations in India and the rest will go to PolioPlus. Already \$25,000,000 has been raised by Rotary. Governor Terry stated that an effective club includes: (1) Sustaining or increasing membership; (2) Implementing successful service projects; (3) Supporting the Foundation; (4) Developing leaders beyond the Club level. The Foundation programs include educational, humanitarian grant and PolioPlus. The challenge is to do what we can to make Dreams Real for the children in our community, our country and around the world. Our dollars do make a difference.
