Secretary of State **Trey Grayson** was elected to office in November 2003 in his first run for political office and at the time of his election was the youngest Secretary of State in the country. In 2007, he became one of only two Republican state-wide elected constitutional officers to win a second consecutive term in modern history. Since taking office, Grayson has quickly become a national leader in elections, civics, business services, and government innovation.

Grayson has modernized the Office of the Secretary of State by bringing more services online, enhanced Kentucky's election laws through several legislative packages, and revived the civic mission of schools in Kentucky by leading the effort to restore civics education in the classroom.

This Week's Speaker...

The program for the day was the Director of KET and fellow Rotarian Mac Wall. He stated that he has been a part of the television industry since 1970. Television is an industry that has changed dramatically from the times when it consisted of an antenna and rabbit ears and was considered an item of furniture. He started with television before cable (BC). Today, television appears on computer screens and laptops. Television viewing is increasing but it is viewed in different venues. Today, digital television can even be seen on a refrigerator! Politicians have to be careful what they say and where they say it because of the ubiquitous nature of television. Today's college freshmen have always had cable, have always had remote control, have known only Jay Leno, have only known Seinfeld references, have never known the telegram, and have known only microwave popcorn. On February 17, television will be in transition from analog to digital, and tuner boxes will be needed if you have an antenna. We will be back to the

old days where you must turn your antenna to get a signal and it is not enough to just have the box. 10% of Kentuckians are not ready for the transition. High definition will now have "surround sound". KET itself has four services and you get four channels. KET remains dedicated to education and providing classroom services, and is a model for the nation as "Kentucky's channel". He is encouraging communities to record their own histories and there is an opportunity to tell local stories. KET is Kentucky's largest classroom with 10 separate media markets. It has the largest footprint of any state network in the nation. 40,000 teachers have been trained in "Encylomedia" and it is no longer necessary for students to power down when they go to school. KET is the producer of GED content for the nation and in 2012 new content will be created for the GED. This is designed to be portable. Mac hopes to continue the forty-year legacy of KET which will continue to bring better public television for the future.
