***Next Week's Speaker...***

**Dr. Thomas Young:**

**Shoulder to Shoulder Ecuador**

Dr. Young is an incredible health advocate for children and youth, throughout Kentucky and internationally. He is the founder of Kentucky Child Now, whose focus is on promoting the healthy development of our children and youth through advocacy, consulting, training and coordination, empowering them to become successful adults. The organization just celebrated its 10-year anniversary. Another project that is dear to Dr. Young's heart is his program in Ecuador. UK's Shoulder to Shoulder Ecuador program began in 2002. That year, Dr. Young, Professor of Pediatrics, College of Medicine, led the first medical brigade to Ecuador with a small group of six committed participants who wanted to make a difference. Associate Professor of Epidemiology Dr. Claudia Hopenhayn joined Tom as brigade co-leader. Since then, services have evolved to include professors, clinicians, and volunteers. In 2008 nearly 1700 patients attended the brigades. Of those, 711 were children, 653 were women and 229 were men. More than 60% of children five years and younger were ane-

mic, and many showed signs of stunted growth. Most common complaints: parasitic infections, respiratory disease, skin conditions, gynecological problems, and mental health issues. Dr. Young will discuss his recent trip to Ecuador.
