This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. Thomas Young, founder of Kentucky Child Now! He spoke about the "Shoulder to Shoulder" partnership between the country of Ecuador, UK, and the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In 2002, medical brigades from UK started going to Ecuador which is a poor country that is about 40% Indian. About one-half of the people live in poverty there and there is a high mortality rate among children under five. Many children die needlessly and one-half of the deaths are due to malnutrition. A medical clinic was set up by the brigades in the city of Santo Domingo and with improvements in basic nutrition and health care, the lives of the children improved dramatically. However, the "Shoulder to Shoulder" program needs community partners in order to succeed to improve the lives of the people

through health care and education. The goals are to improve the quality of life of the people, engage community partners to sponsor the medical brigades to Ecuador and engage students and faculty as volunteers. UK has established a permanent site in Ecuador. Two medical brigades are sent there each year and many are students. They also do home visits and integrate the present medical facilities in medical, dental, and mental health care. Water and sanitation issues are also addressed by the medical brigades. The partnerships also enable young people to learn about cultural differences and clinical exams are performed by the brigades. Dental hygienists pull teeth, clean teeth and apply varnish on the teeth to protect them. Children are taught the basics of dental hygiene by professionals. The brigades also take a pharmacy with them and dispense needed drugs to the patients. The brigades interact with the population by playing soccer and participating in folk dancing. Reading projects are undertaken, books are shipped and distributed, and all of this is done on a \$80,000 budget thanks to the unselfishness of the volunteers. A big Rotary thank you goes out to Mary Poling for an exciting month of programs.
