### Updating Club Directory

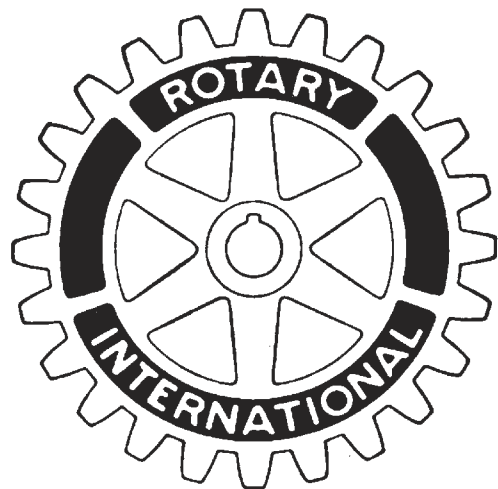

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Captain Sanford Goin (Nicky Hughes) who spoke about life in Frankfort in the 1800s. He was born in Woodford Co. in 1814 and described the Frankfort he knew, which underwent vast changes in his lifetime. He remembered the construction of the State House and the fact that in the 1830s, Frankfort did not have the railroad bridge, but a ferry went across to Bellepoint. There were no locks and dams at that time and there was an island called Fish Trap at the mouth of Benson Creek. Frankfort was the furthestmost point that could be navigated at that time. He described the cholera epidemic of 1832 and the 1853 Gold Rush to California. He recalled the memorial services for the Mexican War dead as well as participating in the defense of Frankfort from John Hunt Morgan's soldiers in the Battle of Fort Hills. Upon the occasion of the surrender of Lee in Virginia, some 300 rounds of cannon fire reverberated from atop Fort Hill.
