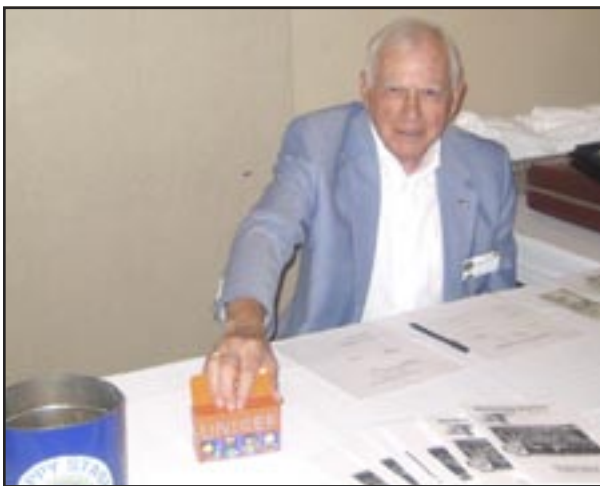

This Week's Speaker...

The speakers for the day were Henry Jason and Jason Delambre who are energy-based consultants. They discussed their insights regarding large-scale conservation efforts and their economic impact. In their planning they study efficiency and sustainability issues and are involved with the Frankfort Plant Board as well as the City Manager. They performed an energy audit for the city and working with the International Council for City Governments mapped out amount of energy used. Only cities qualify for this audit. Their analysis allows

them to measure energy efficiencies and recommend cost savings measures such as turning off desk computers at night. They measure units of energy used involving electricity and gas usage. Having measured energy output, they then recommend goals to the governmental entity and ways of reaching those goals. The concept here is to develop a Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory. The purpose is to quantify and measure and reduce carbon dioxide emissions. The analysis involves a five-step milestone progress using the audit to determine what the entity is actually using. These are (1) Database creation; (2) A local climate protection plan; (3) An implementation program; (4) Monitoring progress; (5) Adjustment as needed. An internationalized software program is used. You take a look at the many aspects involved and how quantities of energy are being processed. The City of Frankfort has 20 major energy-using buildings and about 100 meters. The goal is to find out how much gas and electricity is being used. The process was greatly facilitated by the fact that we are dealing here with a city-owned utility so that much information was readily available about energy usage. The energy audit involved an assessment of city commercial, residential, governmental and transportation usages, which were all thoroughly looked over. Computations

are made to determine actual carbon dioxide output with the aim of reducing emissions. An analysis was done for example to determine the amount of carbon dioxide reduction if the city planted a thousand trees per year. The city in turn enters into partnerships with various agencies and departments with the goal of reducing greenhouse emissions.
