This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was LaDonna H. Thompson, Commissioner of the KY Department of Corrections, and the first woman to serve in that position. Continuing R.B. Brown's October theme of leadership from a woman's perspective, she related how she had come to her present position and what she thinks most important in leadership. While a student at Morehead, she began working in a nearby correctional complex that offered tuition assistance. She found she really liked the staff and purposes of the corrections program. From that point, through mostly-male mentors who supported her advancement and taught her the ropes, she advanced to her present position. There have been numerous challenges since she became Commissioner: a major ice storm;

the controversy at Otter Creek private prison; and the North Point riot. In each case, correctional personnel responded professionally, due to training and their personal commitment to service. Ms. Thompson emphasized the importance of recognizing and appropriately rewarding staff, as well as integrating them into a team of individuals with diverse responsibilities -- working with inmates, parolees, victims, families of both convicted persons and victims. Communication is essential. In Commissioner Thompson's honor, a book celebrating the rise of women leaders, "When Everything Changed," will be donated to the library of the Pewee Valley Correctional Facility for Women.
