This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Nash Cox who spoke about her book, "Portrait of Early Families of the Frankfort Area Before 1860." Sallie Lanham, Bob Lanham and Becky Bolton also participated in the creation of this book. The book features prominent families such as that of Daniel Weisiger who came to Kentucky in 1784 with George Rogers Clark. Other families included those of Thomas Lindsey, the Swigerts, the Blantons, and the Hendricks. There is also a section on the free blacks that lived on a strip of farms from Millville to Pea Ridge. Another prominent early settler

was Captain Russell who fought in the War of 1812. A.W. Macklin is also featured who owned a pork house, flour mill, and ropewalk. The Macklin Dam at the Forks of Elkhorn was a major accomplishment. Stephen Black, who was in the horse business, owned the land where Silver Lakes Subdivision is now located. This is just a sampling of many families featured in the book, currently available at Poor Richard's. In honor of Nash's talk, a copy of her book was donated to the Media Center At Frankfort High.
