



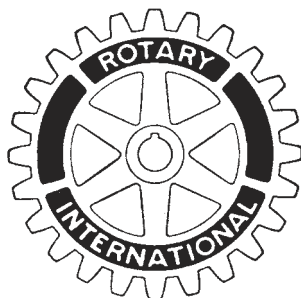

Next Week's Speaker...

Dieter Hennings' musical endeavors span from new music on guitar to early music for lute and baroque guitar. He has been a soloist for Canada's New Music Concerts Ensemble and the University of Arizona Philharmonics. He is an active proponent of new music, particularly that of Latin America. He recently performed Synchronisms no. 10 for guitar and tape for Mario Davidovsky in a concert dedicated to the composer's work. He is a resident artist at the East Coast Composers Ensemble and the Eastman Broad Band Ensemble with whom he maintains an active performing schedule. Dieter Hennings received a Bachelor's degree from the University of Arizona School of Music in Guitar Performance in 2004. The following year he was awarded a Master's degree in Early Plucked Instruments with the world-renowned lutenist Paul O'Dette at the Eastman School of Music. He has recently completed the residency for his Doctoral degree in both Guitar Performance and Early Plucked Instruments at Eastman.

This Week's Speaker...

The speakers for the day were Dan Egbers, who spoke on the subject of state layoffs, and Doug Howard, who spoke about Frankfort's preparations to welcome visitors to the World Equestrian Games. First, Dan stated that layoffs to balance the budget must always be the last option, but that the Constitution requires a balanced budget. In 1979, John Y. Brown laid off 20 percent of the state workforce but in the Riggs case the United States 6th Circuit held

that reorganizing state government justified it. In a later case before the state Supreme Court in the Ayers case, it was held that before an employee could be laid off, the three C's must be considered to assign them elsewhere including cabinet, classification and county. Judge Palmore wrote a well-reasoned dissent which later became the basis for legislation which stated the state must first assign them by county, or if that fails by agency to an available position and finally to another cabinet. Since 1981, there have been no major layoffs and now there are about 25 hoops the state must jump through before anyone could be laid off. 24 states have resorted to furloughs, but not much is accomplished considering what the state loses in paying unemployment benefits. 18 states have done large-scale layoffs, which is in effect a termination. The outlook is dismal in Kentucky since the legislative leaders have announced there will be no tax increases. On a lighter note, Doug spoke about the need for volunteers to work the World Equestrian Games coming to the Horse Park Sept. 25-Oct. 10. The Mustang Club is sponsoring a classic car show to kick off the event in Frankfort, along with a concert on September 24. One can also participate by buying a bench in the "Horsin' Around" project and you can see Sallie Lanham for details.

The board has approved new members Don Dampier and Brenda Rice contingent upon no negative response after publication in the newsletter.
