

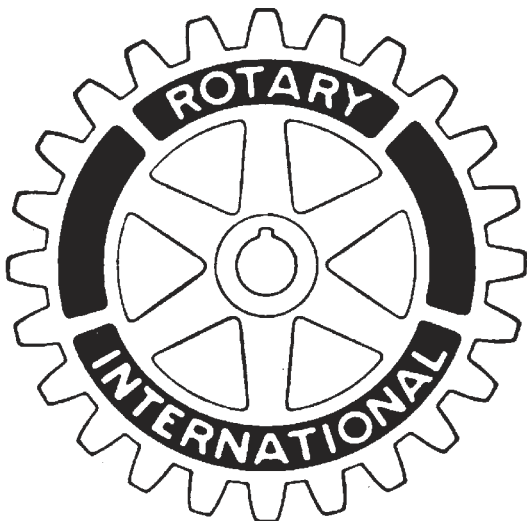

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was KSU President Dr. Mary Sias, who stated that in the midst of all these hard times there are many positive things going on at KSU. She stated that there is a need for students to be better prepared for college, and this may be the first generation where children are less better educated than their parents. Among historically black colleges and universities, KSU is the most diverse. While historically black colleges are only 3% of all public universities, 16% of all black students go to them and 50% of all black professionals. KSU is an 1890 land grant liberal arts university. She is excited about the purchase of the old Paul Sawyer

Library from the city for \$500,000, and KSU has received a \$1 million preservation grant to make renovations although much more will be needed. There will be aquariums at the center and a boat for dinner cruises. Other exciting things happening at KSU include a new masters program in Environmental Sciences and a new doctorate in nursing. She is hoping the legislature will approve the construction of the Betty White Center for Nursing. There is a study abroad program for several foreign countries so those students will have that experience. Because of the presence of many foreign students at KSU, she refers to the university as a "mini UN" on campus. Also in the works is a pedestrian walkway across US 60 and this is especially important in view of the construction of new dorms and there will be about as many students living on both sides of the highway. A childcare center is scheduled for Maryland Avenue. Also a performing arts center is in the works. More programs are available on-line. There are presently 2,834 students enrolled which is the largest in history compared with 2,200 when she came six years ago.

The board approved new member Tom Utterback contingent upon no negative response after publication in the newsletter.

**Program Chair Roster**
