Next Week's Speaker...

Gurney Norman is Kentucky Poet Laureate and is Director of Creative Writing at the University of Kentucky. He is co-editor of a collection of essays, "Back Talk: Confronting Appalachian Stereotypes" published by the University Press. He has written and narrated three one-hour documentary programs concerning Kentucky history, landscape and culture. He and his wife founded Old Cove Press, a regional literary press. A recent issue of "Appalachian Heritage" magazine features a four-page section devoted to Norman's writing and cultural work in the Appalachian region. Gurney attended UK where he majored in Journalism and English. He studied fiction writing at Stanford University and, after a two-year stint in the Army, returned to his hometown to work for a reporter for the Hazard Herald. He has been an English professor at UK since 1979.

Volunteers Needed for WEG

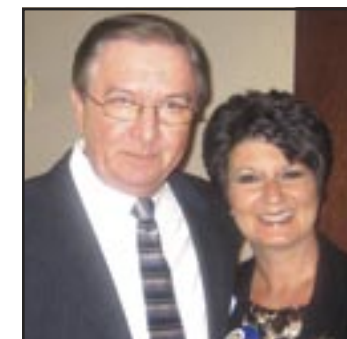

Pictured with Dick Watkins is the speaker for the day Tom Kimmerer, a Senior Scientist with Moore Ventures which is an engineering firm involved in biomass power projects throughout the US. He spoke about carbon-neutral green energy such as solar and hydro-electric power, wind power and geothermal energy. However, he focused on biomass, which is plentiful in Kentucky and consists of wood chips, agriculture crops and waste. Gasification of these products is a new technology whereby biomass is converted to gases and the coal-burning plants can convert some of their capacity to replacement fuels. Less coal is thereby burned and less carbon dioxide and greenhouses gases are produced.
