Stuart Sanders, currently with the Kentucky Historical Society, is former executive director of the Perryville Battlefield Preservation Association, the organization charged with preserving and interpreting Kentucky's largest Civil War battleground. He is now Community Services Administrator for the Kentucky Historical Society, where he works with history organizations across the state. He administers several state commissions, including the Kentucky War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission and the Kentucky Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission. He has written a wide range of Civil War articles for a variety of publications, and is a contributor to Kentuckians in Gray (University Press of Kentucky), Confederate Generals in the Western Theater (volumes 2, 3 and 4) and the forthcoming Confederate Generals in the Trans-Mississippi (University of Tennessee Press). His presentation is entitled "The Aftermath of the Battle of Perryville."

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. Judy Embry, who spoke about the importance of early literacy of children and reading recovery with an emphasis on small-group intervention. She stated that if children reach the fourth grade without being able to read and write, they may be considered future prisoners. She praised former Senator Dan Kelly who sponsored SB 186, which established at UK a center for collaborative learning and expanded reading recovery, which consists of one-on-one intervention for struggling children. At age six, children already know whether they can read and write. However, with an effective program for reading recovery, in 15-20 weeks children can be brought to the average of classroom performance in literacy and need no further intervention. She stated that there is

a sense of urgency in enhancing the literacy of very young children, and cited one example of one student who was brought up to the average from August to December. In an effective intervention of reading recovery program, by the end of the first grade, children can be helped to read chapter books. We need to train teachers with reading recovery backgrounds who can work with children in small groups. She spoke of the "I Three" Grant available through Ohio State University. It consists of \$50 million available to 16 universities working together to help literacy in small children and of this UK has been given \$3 million. As a result, teachers are in training to help over 3,000 students in one year in 266 schools involving 400 teachers and 24 teacher leaders working locally with schools. Reading recovery does indeed touch the lives of many children. She advised parents and grandparents alike of the importance of reading to your children and grandchildren. On the local level, Franklin County is rather unique since we have an early literacy academy here.
