Dr. James H. Tidwell is Professor and Chair of the Division of Aquaculture Program at the Kentucky State University. He is a native of Alabama and received his BS in Biology from the Univ. of Alabama-Birmingham, his MS in Biology from Samford University, and his Ph.D. in Aquaculture from Mississippi State Univ. He has been at KSU since 1987. He is author or co-author on more than 100 refereed journal publications, over 10 book chapters and editor of two reference books. He is also Adjunct Professor in the Animal Science Department at the University of Kentucky and a Certified Fisheries Scientist. Dr. Tidwell was President of the U.S. Aquaculture Society in 1996-97 and of the World Aquaculture Society in 2001-02. His wife Vicki is a teacher at Frankfort High School, his son Will is a sophomore at KSU, Daughter Chandler is entering Northern Kentucky University, and son Patrick is a Junior at Frankfort High.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Al Smith who made some astute observations about the mid-term elections. He stated that the most frustrated people in Congress are bound to be Mitch McConnell, Rand Paul and Hal Rogers. While Rand Paul has pledged to reduce spending and oppose increasing the deficit/debt, he will be stopped by McConnell and Rogers, who will oppose ending earmarks and cut spending. Rogers was fourth in Congress in number of earmarks and McConnell was eighth. While Paul and the Tea Party will want to go one way in voting against the debt ceiling, McConnell and Rogers – as well as the Republican establishment – will oppose this. As to repealing the health care law (known as ObamaCare) this cannot be done with a Democratic Senate and Obama in the White House. Rather, cost containment measures would be preferable. Why



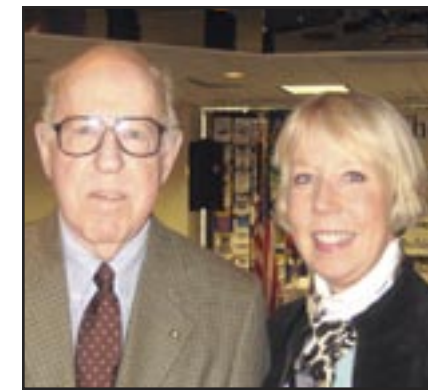

did the Democrats lose seats? The answer is the same as why Republicans lost seats from 2004 to 2006. The Democrats had no answer to the country's economic woes and the Republicans are now going to have to answer to a jobless recovery, entitlement spending, a bad economy and a shrinking middle class. More than anything, the country needs tax reform than even a tax cut. Although the healthcare plan will not be repealed, the country needs a plan to slow the growth of entitlements. Will Obama forfeit the White House? The answer is probably "no" as long as he is better than his competition. The President is able to better read the evidence and come to the right conclusion. The Republicans cannot go with Mitt Romney since Obama's health care plan was modeled after Romney's in Massachusetts. There are two forces at play here. For one thing, the business cycle may become favorable to Obama and recover. Secondly, Obama may unite with the Republicans and prepare for military action against Iran. The economy would rise and this would all be favorable to the reelection of the President. Also, Osama Bin Laden may be found and killed or captured which would help Obama. However, today both Democrats and Republicans are equally unpopular. There is no mandate to repeal healthcare, and 77% of the

electorate want Republicans and Democrats to work together. The most important lesson to be gleaned from the mid-term elections is that the country wants to go in a different direction to make the country better.
