**Ky. House Speaker Gregory D. Stumbo**

In January 2009, nearly a year after starting his second tenure in the Kentucky House of Representatives, his legislative colleagues elected Greg House Speaker. That honor culminated nearly three decades of public service in elected office, beginning when he became Floyd County's state representative in 1980. He became House Majority Floor Leader five years later, making him the youngest state legislator in the nation to hold that title. By 2003, when he was elected as Kentucky's Attorney General, he had accumulated 19 years in House leadership, giving him the longest uninterrupted service ever by a Kentuckian. A member of the Kentucky Bar Association and the American Bar Association, Speaker Stumbo received his law degree from the University of Louisville and his undergraduate degree from the University of Kentucky. Speaker Stumbo enjoys hunting, fishing, golfing and is also a private pilot who has flown his own plane for more than 20 years. He has three children – Margan, Brooks and Cassidy – and is married to the former Mary Karen Henderson. They reside in his home town of Prestonsburg.

**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Dr. Michael Karpf who, in October 2003, was recruited to the University of Kentucky as the Executive Vice President for Health Affairs to integrate the clinical services. He is responsible for all clinical operations across the university hospital, medical center (including all schools and colleges), and private organizations (Kentucky Medical Services Foundation and University Physicians Groups Council). In his first year with UK Health Care he has led the enterprise through a comprehensive planning review, which culminated in a 30-year vision for the replacement of both the clinical and academic campuses. He sees his role as being a referee between the hospital and college and has communicated with both the trustees and faculty. Regarding UK's specialty services, it

is a level-one trauma center, is the only full-time pediatric center, practices excellence in the area of bone marrow transplants, number one in obstetricians, but always strives to keep people near their homes where the treatment is less expensive through local facilities where possible. There are public policy reasons to help local institutions. Among the critical success functions are to work on efficiency, quality of health care and patient safety. Some 200 physicians have been recruited and the medical center provides a network that even reaches into adjoining states. This approach has grown to the point that the UK Medical Center has 34,000 discharges last year and has grown by 70% over the last seven years. The UK Medical Center has been fundamentally transformed, and UK is now among the best hospitals in the country. There has been strategic planning to serve health-care plans of Kentucky and beyond. We are continuing to make relationships with regional providers and less than 30% of patients to UK Medical Center come from Fayette County and 80% of the patients come from the university community. By the same token, the Bluegrass Region works with local hospitals and helps them expand their services. Bluegrass patients are primarily referrals

and as to the balance of Kentucky and beyond, 40% come from over 35 miles. These patients are beset with the most complex medical problems. Therefore, there is a need to expand access to kidney and liver transplants. As the medical center has grown clinically, it has expanded academically as well. He did a video of the new Albert B. Chandler Hospital, which is on schedule and below budget. The new hospital is a \$450 million partial replacement of the old hospital.
