Next Week's Speaker...

Steven L. Beshear was elected governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky in November 2007. An attorney by profession, Gov. Beshear has a long background in public service, having served as a state representative in the Kentucky General Assembly, attorney general and lieutenant governor prior to being elected governor. Gov. Beshear is a native of Dawson Springs in Hopkins County, Ky., where he was one of five children of a Baptist minister and a mother dedicated to her community. He has a bachelor's degree and law degree from the University of Kentucky, where he was president of the student body. He also served as an intelligence analyst in the U.S. Army Reserve, where he also carried out certain JAG duties. Beshear has long been deeply involved in the community, and his various civic activities include such organizations as Commerce Lexington Inc., the Kentucky Horse Park Foundation, God's Pantry Food Bank, Bluegrass Tomorrow, the Kentucky World Trade Center, and the UK College of Law Visiting Committee. He and his wife, Jane, have been married since 1969 and co-own a horse farm in Clark County. They have two sons: Jeff, a veterinarian; and Andy, an attorney; and three grandchildren.
