The speaker for the day was Ralph Tharp, the new Economic Development director for the Kentucky Capital Development Corporation who spoke on the Pathway to Investment and Development. He stated that investors look at several critical elements before investing in a community. These include the atmosphere needed to create jobs. They look at whether there is ready land, affordable energy, whether there are incentives to flip the switch, infrastructure transportation, quality of life and confidence in the leadership of the community. Regarding the tax base, it may be too low to attract businesses, which look at the upkeep of

the infrastructure and school system. Economic development invites investment, which invites pioneers to innovate and renovate. Investors also look toward how the community is positioned in the global economic environment. This includes how are we perceived in the global economy? How do we market our community globally? Economic development reminds him of the application of the Rotary Four Way Test. We must create a vision for the future for the future of Frankfort, promote sustainability, the vision must be maintained, and finally, we must promote development in accordance with the vision. To do this we must think regionally. The state of the economic health of Frankfort is good because with state government we have a stable work force. We must be preparing for Generation Y, which was born between 1980-2005. This generation will demand urban walkways, green travel and living, smaller homes, no grass to mow, smaller families, and a preference for outdoor activities and parks. Frankfort must be prepared to give Generation Y what it wants which may include the Thoroughbred rail system linking Lexington, Frankfort, and Louisville and riverfront development.
