**This Week's Speaker...**

The speaker for the day was Andy McDonald, who spoke about the Frankfort Climate Action Network and what we can do on the local, state, national, and international levels to combat climate change and reduce our carbon footprints. We are confronting climate change by the Kyoto Protocol, the summits in Copenhagen and Cancun and in November of this year in Durban, South Africa. The Kyoto Protocol is set to expire at the end of 2012 but the United States never signed on to it. One of the bones of contention was that developed nations made agreements to reduce carbon emissions but developing nations did not have to sign on. Although a fund was supposedly set up to help developing nations cope with the effects of climate change, it was not implemented. Deforestation is a major problem, since it contributes to the greenhouse effect. Technological transfers from developed to developing nations have been proposed, but inspections were opposed from nations like China. What is needed is a new international agreement but climate change legislation has not passed Congress even with Democrats in

charge of the Congress and the White House and the prospects are even more remote with the GOP now in charge in the House. The EPA is moving to regulate carbon emissions but the GOP is trying to restrict the EPA in this area and the result is much in doubt. There are many state and local initiatives to combat climate change, particularly in the Northeast and California. In California, a referendum to restrict efforts to reduce carbon emissions was defeated. On the local level, over 1,000 mayors have signed an agreement to reduce carbon emissions (Frankfort has also signed this agreement), which covers 88 million Americans. There is a global movement with 7,000 events in 188 countries to increase awareness of the problem. In 2010, Lighten Up Frankfort (LUF) was started to reduce carbon footprints in our homes. This helps us to assess how to make changes in our carbon footprints with 230 Frankfort households participating. Together they have reduced carbon footprints by 6.4 tons per household. Churches, businesses, governments, and individuals are all participating in LUF and Rotary was also invited to become a partner.
