This Week's Speaker...

Today's speaker was Diane Wellman, Manager of the local Humane Society Animal Shelter. Diane has been in that position for 3 weeks, but brings a wide variety of experiences in taking care of animals that are victims of natural disasters, mistreatment, etc. The local Humane Society is a small one, but does a lot and needs the support of the community atlarge. Volunteers are always needed to walk, brush, and socialize the animals. While the shelter receives some funding from the city and county as part of it's animal control work, it needs contributions of money and supplies, including food, cat litter, and cleaning supplies. Diane's vision is for the shelter to become a model for others and a teaching facility. To do that, the shelter needs to move into a larger facility that's not flood-prone. In response to several questions, Diane said that staff is usually there on weekends and holidays even if the shelter is not officially open. Anyone

wanting to drop of an animal can phone the number posted at the building. The call will go to voice mail, but the staff members who are there are monitoring it and will receive the animal. She said micro-chipping pets is a good idea, but very few people do so. The shelter has micro-chipping clinics. The process is no worse for the animal than a vaccination. The pet owner needs to keep location and contact information current and should have a back-up contact, such as a vet. A centralized database or universal chip reader is needed to access the data, since several companies are in the business. The shelter's current policy is to euthanise rarely, only if the animal is dangerously aggressive or is so sick or injured that it has a very low quality of life. The animal is sedated first and held and petted by a staff member. The book Pick a Pup will be given to a local elementary school in Ms. Wellman's honor.

Shelterbox Update

The club will be purchasing two shelter-boxes for Japan tragedy. The club was able to collect \$2,000, which will purchase two boxes from donations of fellow Rotarians and other outside contributors.
