Next Week's Speaker...

Michael Flynn Turner was born on April 8, 1984 and grew up in Frankfort. He attended Second Street School and in 2002 graduated from Frankfort High. In 2006, Michael earned a Bachelor's Degree in History with a concentration in Social Sciences and a minor in Political Science from the University of Louisville. In 2007, Michael completed graduate work by obtaining a Master's Degree in Teaching from the University of Louisville. Following college Michael accepted a position with Roeding Group Companies, where he currently serves as an insurance agent and Director of Operations for their Public Entity Division.

In 2008, Mayor Bill May appointed Michael to the City of Frankfort Board of Ethics, as well as the Frankfort/Franklin County Board of Zoning Adjustments. Michael served the people of Frankfort on those boards until 2010. In January 2010, Michael declared his candidacy for the Frankfort City Commission and was elected to that position last November. At age 26 Michael is one of the youngest City

Commissioners in Frankfort's history and is the youngest Commissioner currently serving on the board.

Michael is also very active throughout the community. He is a member of the P.U.S.H. Board of Directors, the Franklin County Democratic Executive Committee, and is the Vice President of the Franklin County Young Democrats. Michael is a member of the South Frankfort Neighborhood Association, and frequently volunteers for organizations such as the Franklin County Women's Shelter and the Franklin County Council on Family Abuse.

Michael believes that local government is "the front line of democracy," and that citizen participation is key to Frankfort reaching its potential. His major policy goals include increasing openness and transparency and making Frankfort more user-friendly.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Steve Reeder, who is the director of the Kentucky River Authority. He stated that because the Army Corps of Engineers was pulling out of maintaining the locks and dams on the Kentucky River, the legislature created the Kentucky River Authority to perform the responsibilities formerly performed by the Corps. There are some 14 locks and dams on the river and 11 major cities, some of which get their water from the Kentucky River. The two principal reasons for creation of the Authority was because the Corps was pulling out of Kentucky and to maintain adequate water and recreation for the citizens of Central Kentucky. In 2006, \$50,000,000 was appropriated by the state, funded by maintenance fees on water bills. Several dams have been replaced but only Lock 4 is still safe to operate at Bellepoint. The first priority is to make sure the people get their water and then move on to repair the locks.
