Board Action

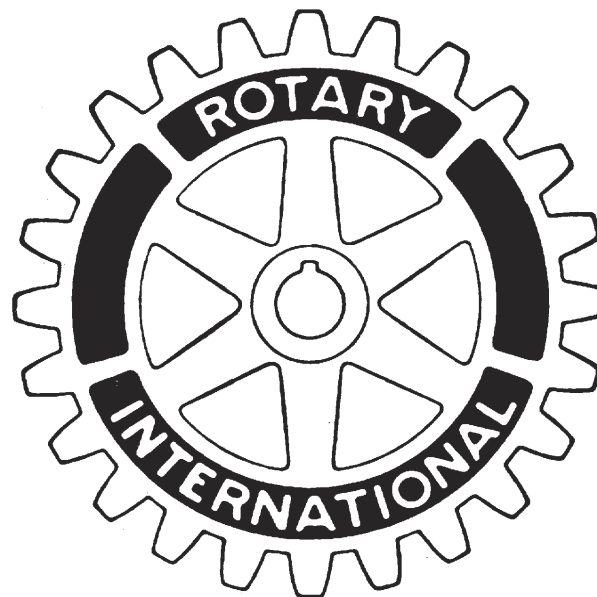
The board approved new member Kevin Grimm contingent upon no negative response after publication in the newsletter.

This Week's Speaker...

Sandy Canon, former KY Child Care Administrator and Lexington Rotarian, spoke on the economic case for xthe investment in early childhood education. She was accompanied by Sarah Vanover of the state Division of Child Care and Jill Robinson with the Prichard Committee. Early childhood education is important because the traits we have are basically established in the first 5 years of life; and the first 3 years of life are key to healthy brain development. She contrasted the number of words heard by age 4 in homes with parents on public assistance (13 million words), working-class parents (26 million), and parents who are professionals (45 million).

The number of words in a 3-year-old's vocabulary ranges from parents on public assistance (500 words); working class parents (750); and parents who are professionals (1,100). Long-term studies show the return on investment in early childhood education is \$7 to \$1, and \$5 to \$1 in KY. A Chicago study shows that children that have been in child care show lower incidences of needing special education, have lower juvenile arrest rates, and greater high-school completion rates than non-participants. KY's preschool program covers 3-4 year olds with disabilities and children 4 year olds from families with incomes at or below 150% of the poverty rate. There are 24,000 in preschool, 13,000 with disabilities. KY needs to expand pre-K to children in homes with income at or below 200% of the poverty rate. KY also needs to expand pre-K through a collaborative model involving schools, childcare, and Head Start. Citizens can help by contacting elected officials to talk about funding, talking with friends and neighbors, and signing up to receive action alerts.
