This Week's Speaker...



Dr. Ullin Leavell, a graduate of Vanderbilt and Duke University Medical School, is a retired dermatologist. He was head of the UK Medical School Dermatology Department and a founding member of a private practice, Dermatology Associates. Dr.

Leavell has been photographing birds for 30 years and has won Eastman Kodak photographic contests. He showed slides of 21 different types of birds taken on or near Vero Beach FL, Bosque NM, and St. Simon Island, GA. Two of the pictures were of endangered species, the whooping crane and the scrub jay. Both were banded for tracking. One set of slides were taken at Pelican Island, the first National Preserve, which was established by President Teddy Roosevelt to protect pelicans who were being killed for their feathers to decorate ladies' hats. In photographing birds, Dr. Leavell advised that if the eye is in focus, the rest of the bird will be in focus. He said that he, among others, had sought to persuade the KY Fish and Wildlife Department to not allow the shooting of sand cranes, which they have done. One concern is that sand cranes and the endangered whooping crane fly together. In response to questions, Dr. Leavell said that ospreys do migrate through KY and herons are common on Elkhorn Creek. Vultures gather where something has recently died, and they are said to be able to smell death from 2-3 miles away. He hasn't been to KY Lake to see the eagles, but hopes to do so. The best time to see them is in the winter or early spring. The book Complete Guide to Kentucky Birds will be presented to a local library in Dr. Leavell's honor

RI receives multiple honors for its publications
