This Week's Speaker...

Today's speaker was City Commissioner and fellow Rotarian Sellus Wilder who talked about a proposed new city trash collection/recycling system and fee structure. Currently, there is a \$5 per month trash collection fee, payable in two \$30 installments each year. The July payments were suspended pending a decision on changes. In 3 public forums, the majority of participants favored charging for how much a household throws away. The second-place option was not changing the current system. Feedback from the forums helped develop the current proposal. The city would provide each household with two wheeled bins, one for trash and one for recycling. The bins would come in 3 sizes: small (35 gallons), medium (65 gallons), and large (95 gallons). There would be no charge for the recycling bins. The small trash bin would be free, the medium one would cost \$4/month, and the large one would cost \$12/month. The city will pick up yard waste and bulky items free of charge. The commissioners chose to alter fees and not reduce taxes, because tax payments are tax deductible, but fees are not. A lot of cities in the U.S. already have this program and have seen about a 15% reduction in operating expenses due to lower tipping fees, greater recycling revenue, and lower workers compensation and insurance costs due to automation of trash/recycling collection that's possible with uniform-sized cans. The city estimates that, with up-front capital costs, the system will break even in five years and then result in savings. Each household will be allowed 12 free overflow bags per year and can buy additional ones. There will be 4 free pickup days for excess garbage, e.g. spring cleaning. The city can compost yard waste if it's piled at the curb or put in paper yard waste bags. If it's put in plastic bags it goes to the landfill. In response to questions, Sellus said that when the new system is in place, old garbage cans and the red recycling bins can be taken to the curb and will be picked up. Use

of the roll-out carts in Crestwood subdivision on a trial basis met with overwhelmingly positive support. The city can recycle any plastic item with a triangular recycling symbol on it. Although he favored a small charge for the smallest trash can, the compromise was no fee. The book Touch Point: Creating Powerful Leadership Connections in the Smallest of Moments will be donated to a local library in Sellus's honor.
