Next Week's Speaker...

Next week is a panel discussion with two separate businesses that use e-commerce and/or social media.

Chris Miller from the Woolery: The Woolery was started in 1981 in Genoa, NY by the Horchlers. We started as a small farm offering wool (from sheep on the Horchlers farm), basic supplies and spinning lessons. We called ourselves "Woolery Farm". A few years after starting, we opened the "Fingerlakes Woolen Mill" but the mill was sold when, in 2001, The Woolery expanded and moved to Murfreesboro, North Carolina. In 2009 The Woolery was purchased by Chris & Nancy, expanded again and moved to historic Frankfort, Kentucky. Chris and Nancy Miller, the owners, bring years of experience to The Woolery, as well as a passion for spinning, weaving and knitting. They absolutely love fiber arts and love the people involved; the people mean the most to them. They have been married for 27 years and have two sons, a grandchild and a character named Christian who thinks he is human but is really a "Snoodle." "We are very excited to relocate the business to an area that is much more accessible to the public. We have customers from all

over the world and at least once a day we see someone who makes a special trip or makes a detour from their travels to come and visit or shop. We are known for our friendly, fast and excellent customer service."

Tony Charters from Capital Cellars: Capital Cellars opened in 2006 with the objective of becoming distinguished as the best wine and spirits retail store and wine café in Frankfort by providing excellent customer service, a unique atmosphere and a selection of products that larger "warehouse" stores may not carry. The community embraced Capital Cellars prior to its opening. Family and volunteers came off the street to help renovate the space. The community continues to support the business and in turn, Capital Cellars works to support other local downtown businesses. Today Capital Cellars is recognized as a destination, with a reputation of providing comfortable, friendly and effortless shopping. Capital Cellars offers Wine Classes through Franklin County Community Education, free wine tastings on Thursday and Friday evenings, and a Wine Club. Capital Cellars actively promotes and sells wine from Kentucky vineyards in addition to specialty bourbons and beers. Originally from Madison, Wisconsin, owner Rachael Peake moved to Kentucky in 1992 and completed a M.S. in Biology from Eastern Kentucky University. Later experience of being a Regional Sales Manager for Sazerac, a major US wine and spirits import company, and working in quality control at Buffalo Trace Distillery have contributed to Rachael's knowledge of the wine industry. She met and married her husband Daniel while working in Frankfort and they have two children 2 and 4 years old.
