

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Dr. Larry Hood who spoke about Pearl Harbor. He stated that in 1600, Japan closed itself off to the world which lasted for 250 years. This was during the period when Jamestown was founded in 1607. However, the British were on the move and Admiral Perry of the United States opened Japan in 1853, signed a treaty and set up a mission there. 50 years later, Japan won a war with Russia and Japan opened up and set its sights on expansion. While Japan began looking outward, the United began looking inward after World War I and in 1921 began to disarm with the Washington Naval Conference that left the United States, Britain and Japan with the most ships which was to Japan's advantage since all its ships were in one place. Because Japan does not have many natural resources, it began to expand and in 1931 invaded Manchuria and Depression. Countries were on the move in Europe and so was Japan but the United States enacted Neutrality Acts in 1935-36 and had an arms embargo with all countries that were at war unless they paid in cash. In 1937, Japan invaded Nanking and killed 250,000. Japan expanded into China and an American ship was actually sunk there but this was ignored by the American public due to isolationism. This began to change with the growing threat from Germany and Japan so in 1939 the United States again began selling arms as long as it was in cash and carried in that nation's ships. However, a movement called "America First" promoted by such people as Walt Disney wanted to keep America out of these foreign wars. Then Japan invaded French Indo-China in 1940 and the United States beefed up forces in the Pacific. In July 1941, the United States embargoed oil to Japan and Japan invaded the Dutch Indies. In November, the Japanese Emperor authorized the bombing of Pearl Harbor which occurred on December 7 but only battleships were targeted and the Japanese knew the aircraft carriers were not in Pearl Harbor. The Japanese wrongly thought that by knocking out the battleships, the United States would be so demoralized that we would not go to war and would negotiate a settlement. This did not happen. The United States was unprepared for the sneak attack which lasted for 90 minutes in two waves. Four battleships were sunk but three were repaired. 2,402 Americans were killed which included 68 civilians. Half of those killed were on the Arizona which exploded from ammunition aboard that ship. War was declared the next day. The fictitious character of Rosie the Riveter was created but a live person soon took on this role to sell War Bonds and encourage everyone to get involved in the war effort. This was a tactical victory for the Japanese but was a strategic error. 16 million Americans were soon in the service and

Shanghai. The United States did not want to

get involved and was in the middle of the Great

American factories put out twice the war materials as all the Axis powers combined. This was truly the Greatest Generation which took us from outhouses to the moon. We also won the Cold War and produced the greatest economy in history. However, a warning comes from Benjamin Franklin when asked what type of government we would have said, "A Republic, if you can keep it."
