

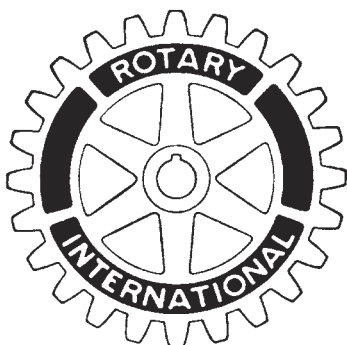


Barry Holder stands with DG-Elect Ed Kalmey, elected for the term after Don Dykman's term. Ed was a visiting Rotarian.

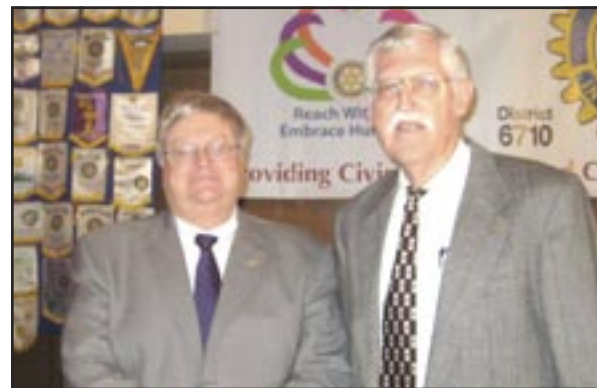

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was District Governor Rick O. Baumgardner. This was the last Club he has visited this year. He stated that most District Governors emphasize primarily the Rotary Foundation and membership. He asked the question whether each of us is a member or a Rotarian. A good member participates in the Foundation and keeps up his or her attendance but a Rotarian goes far beyond this. Admittedly the Four Way Test is difficult to live up to, but this is a worthy goal. To do so is to move from being a mere member to becoming a Rotarian. He showed a video titled, "This is Rotary" which asked how we make the transition from member to Rotarian. The video demonstrated how the Rotary PolioPlus campaign has eliminated 99% of this dreaded disease, and showed how Rotary has a special relationship with the United Nations which gives Rotary access to foreign governments around the world. Last year there were no new cases of polio in India, which at one time had the highest rate of polio per capita in the world. When Benjamin Franklin was asked why he had a lantern on his patio he said it was not for himself but was to light the way for others. This is like Rotary, which is lighting the way for others. Family support cannot be over-emphasized in importance for being a good Rotarian. There are dangers in being both a part-time and a full-time Rotarian. It is important to have the proper balance in our lives. Caring, touching, and healing are also attributes of a good Rotarian. We need to lead by example, because great leaders rise to the occasion to meet the needs of these times whether it is Mother Teresa or Abraham Lincoln. We simply must get out of our comfort zones. While it is good to be flexible, nevertheless we must be firm in our commitments. We must admit when we are wrong and in all that we do as Rotarians such as ringing the Salvation Army bell, we thereby enhance the Rotary image. We must all be lamps in our communities.
