



In 1917 R.I. President Arch Klumph proposed the establishment of an endowment fund—the forerunner of The Rotary Foundation. The fund received its first contribution in 1918—US\$26.50—from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, U.S.A. By 1990, contributions totaled more than US\$554 million. Moreover, Foundation grants have enabled some 21,000 scholars to grow in knowledge and promote world understanding; more than 278 million children to be immunized against polio; and countless people to enjoy safe drinking water, accessible health care and schools, and improved nutrition.



THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Nell Cox, Hollywood Director/Film-Maker and Frankfort native, was the guest smpeaker of the Frankfort Rotary Club on January 7, 1992.

Nell pursued her filmaking career by completing a Master's Degree in Film while living in Paris, France. Her first Directorial Job was an episode of the Walton's.. Nell explained the difference between directing a one hour television program and directing a theatrical feature. Filming a one hour television show requires seven days of preparation and seven days to film. Filming a movie requires even more time -- eight weeks or more to prepare, work with the actors, film and edit. When Nell first began her career fewer than 1/10 of 1% of directors were female. Today 7% of the movie directors are female.

Films are much more expensive to make these days with the average cost being \$25-30 million. Why do movies cost this much? Today we have a poor economy, million dollar actor's salary, plus the studio takes their cut. Then you have the screenwriters who do rewrites at \$100,000 a week and don't forget theft and other costs that we the average moviegoer do not even think about! That's why it costs \$6.00 for a Movie ticket!



THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Rotary's own Jack Owens, a man of many and diverse careers, talked about his experiences in the Japanese Business world. Jack noted that the Japanese are groat facilitators and innovators and will take a product or a process and improve upon it until the outcome is a superior product.

As a quality control engineer for General Electric in Japan, Jack said that the Japanese quality control is one of the reasons for their ability to produce superior products. He expressed concern over the recent announcement by American automakers that we will begin selling American cars in Japan. . Owens said that the logistics of Japanese streets, parking spaces and parking garages do not allow for large American made cars. American automakers do not advertise in Japan and have not made changes in American cars to fit the Japanese driver, as the Japanese have done for the American driver. Jack said that, rather than forcing our product on them, negotiations are needed to enhance what is a very low sales potential in Japan - the American car.






