THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker today was Lillian Nunnelly, Director of the Learning Center. She spoke on Literacy. The printed page is a blank page to people who can't read. We aren't just talking about people who can't read or write but, we are talking about people who can't function in their society.

Twenty-three million adult Americans are functioning illiterates. Last year we had 250 drop outs in Franklin County. Because of illiteracy entry level jobs are going unfilled. Most jobs will require education beyond the high school level in the future. One half of all heads of households can't read beyond 8th grade level. The Learning Center served 77 persons with reading levels under the 5th grade. It served 110 juveniles at the county jail. Six of whom got their GED's. Last year over 800 persons were served at the Learning Center. The Learning Center has a jobs program for people receiving aid for dependent children. Persons move easily from one group to another at the Learning Center. What can you do to help? You can serve as a tutor and or donate money for books and software for the center.

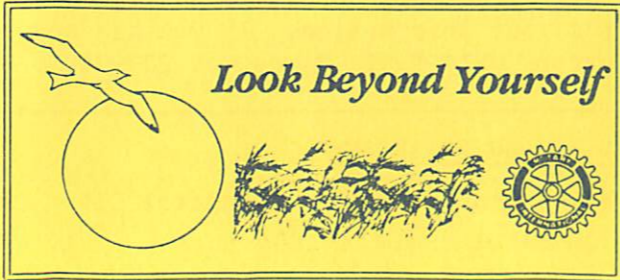

OFFICE ECOLOGY

Cut the Cups

You take one last sip of coffee and throw it in the trash can. Now it's time to get down to work. Sound familiar? This routine is repeated day after day, sometimes even many times a day by office workers world-wide. The average office worker in North America goes through around 500 disposable cups a year.

All those empty cups and related utensils are easy to toss, but they don't just disappear. In fact, most plastic coffee cups are made from polystyrene foam. In a landfill, they don't break down. Even paper cups don't break down easily. In fact in a landfill, almost nothing breaks down. It just sits there.

Simple things to do:

- Issue each employee a ceramic mug, perhaps with your company logo or environmental message printed on the side.
- Or keep sturdy mugs, not styrofoam or paper cups, near the office coffee pot.
- Don't buy plastic stirrers; just keep some spoons on hand.
- Arrange for your cafeteria or coffee shop to give a discount to employees who bring their own mug when buying a cup of coffee.
- If there is space to wash dishes, make durable plastic dishes available for employee use.
- Arrange with owners of nearby carry-out to give discounts to employees who bring their own mugs. See if they'll let employees bring their own dishes or plastic containers for the salad bar.
