#### THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Secretary of State Bob Babbage spoke to Rotary on voter registration and voter participation.

Babbage said that nationwide, only one-third of the population who could vote did so and various projects to register new voters has been met with much success especially efforts to register voters in the workplace.

As Secretary of State, Babbage is the chief election official for Kentucky and continues to emphasize voter registration and turnout. He has instituted several programs in all areas, including business, labor, schools and civic groups to encourage voter registration.

Kentucky to date has 2,076,263 voters - 200,000 more voters this year than last year. Three-fourths of Kentucky's population is now registered to vote, and of those approximately 184,000 new registrants, 100,000 are age 35 and under. Babbage noted the importance of involvement at an early age, saying that the process itself can encourage young people to seek positions of leadership.

The Honorable Chris Gorman, Attorney General for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, was the guest speaker of the Frankfort Rotary Club for Wednesday, October 21, 1992.

Mr. Gorman, born and reared in Frankfort, began his political career in Jefferson County. He believes that the highest service one can perform is public service. As Attorney General, Mr. Gorman is most interested in "helping those who cannot access the system to help themselves." His special interests include women, children, consumer and the environment.

The Attorney General's Office, in conjunction with the Kentucky Domestic Violence Task Force, was very instrumental in the passage of key domestic violence legislation, such as:

- 1.) 24-hour access to Emergency Protective Orders:
- 2.) Anti-stalking Laws: and
- 3.) Use of prior abuse histories (women and children) in court cases.

In the coming months Attorney General Gorman will focus on child sexual abuse. A fifty-five member Child Sexual Abuse Task Force has been appointed and they will undertake the passage o legislation with emphasis to:

- 1.) utilize a statewide mult-disciplinary approach in treating the offender:
- 2.) compiling a registry of offenders (for local law enforcement knowledge and use): and
- 3.) DNA legislation.
