THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Barry Peal, of WKYT-TV in Lexington was today's speaker. He stated that a torch has been passed to a new generation. Clinton is the first President born after World War II. For the last 50 years our economic policy has been based on fear of another depression. Foreign Policy is based on no more Pearl Harbors. Clinton has no memory of either of these. The new President and Vice-President are both southerners but, didn't win a solid South. Clinton is the first Democrat to win without Texas. Since the end of the cold War foreign economics competition is what we have to worry about now. The Democrats have found that the votes are in the broad center and not the far right. All politics are local. Jones told Clinton he would have to come to the first district to win Kentucky. Clinton is a plurality President. His vote would have been bigger if Perot had not been in the race. The election campaigns were more concerned with themes than specific issues. Television is more heat than light. It militates against an intellectual response. Important issues weren't discussed in the campaigns. We talk about things that don't count. THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Dr. Lilialyce Akers, a sociology professor at the University of Louisville and president of the Kentucky Division of the United Nations Association, spoke to Rotary about her experiences at the Earth Summit Conference held earlier this year in Rio De Janeiro.

Over 178 countries, represented by 118 heads of state, attended the conference. Dr. Akers said that never had so many leaders been in the same room at the same time and reached a consensus. Developed from the conference was the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development. Several issues were incorporated into the declaration, including protecting the atmosphere, protecting land resources, conversation of biological diversity, protecting freshwater resources and protecting oceans, seas and coastal areas and developing those living resources.

Dr. Akers is now working on the follow-up conference on implementing the goals of the Rio conferences. Kentucky is the host for the May, 1993 conference which will focus on sustainable development.

Rotary was represented at the Rio Conference and Dr. Akers asked for Rotarians help and involvement in Kentucky's upcoming conferences.

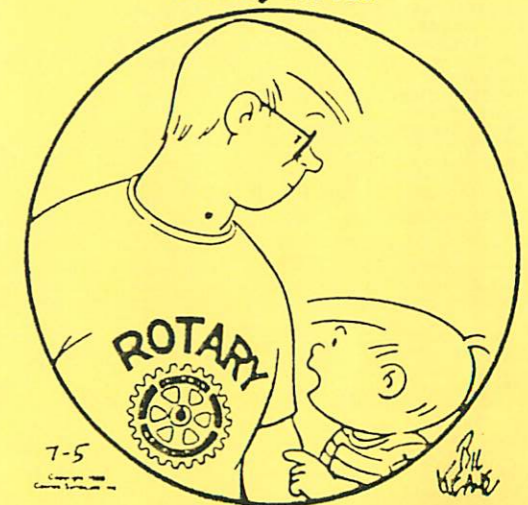

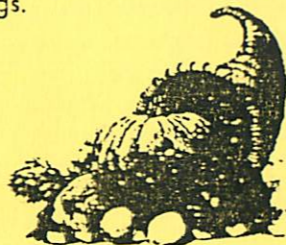


THE BOUNTY OF HARVEST
