THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Chuck Warnick with the Kentucky Historical Society spoke about the Civil War and about what the common soldier did on a day to day basis including camplife, drills, training etc. He participates in reenactments of various battles such as the Battle of Perryville. He puts on First Person programs which were started by Nicky Hughes where the actor takes on the persona of a particular soldier. The actor adopts the persona to educate people about the life of the common soldier. This is living history. He demonstrated the following items which belonged to the soldier: The Burnside hat, the field hat, the Officer's cap, the staff officer's cap, the staff officer's sword (only reproductions of the sword are used in reenactments). He also demonstrated an 1858 Remington revolver used by the cavalry. He showed a cavalry sabre, shoes (they were not left or right but conformed to the foot), various coats and jackets and boots worn by both sides. We thank Chuck for this most interesting and informative program.

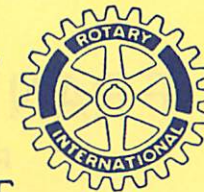

FRANKFORT ROTARY CLUB BOARD MEETING

There will be a Board meeting on March 15, 1993 at 5:00 p.m. at the Frankfort Electric and Water Plant Board Office.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for today was Jim Huggins of the FBI. The FBI is an investigatory agency of the Department of Justice. The Bureau investigates 240 federal violations of law. It is the largest law enforcement agency and has concurrent jurisdiction with the Dept. of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and the two are working together on the World Trade Center bombing. The FBI also has concurrent jurisdiction with the Federal Drug Administration in drug cases. The FBI works on drug cases which are of major importance. Other areas are counterterrorism, drug cases involving Columbian cartels, and foreign counterintelligence. Foreign agents often try to steal technological secrets. Lexington is a center for this because of UK and the presence of many foreign students. Another area of investigation involves organized crime. The old mafia has been largely neutralized and organized crime is now in disarray. In Mississippi, the Ku Klux Klan was mostly destroyed through the use of informants. Another area is violent crime which involves bank robberies, extortion, high-jackings etc. Also investigated is white collar crime which includes Savings and Loan failures, public corruption and BOPROT. There are 56 field offices in the U.S. mostly in major cities. There are 400 resident agencies like in Frankfort. Each agent has an average 25-30 cases.

There are 17 foreign liaison posts in foreign embassies. Corrupt sheriffs have been convicted in Kentucky using undercover agents. An undercover operation works as follows: First, it is documented through credible sources that a crime is ongoing. Second, it is shown that conventional investigative means are fruitless. A proposal is then written with a budget which can operate for 6 months. Extensions may be granted. Finally, the Attorney General signs off on it. Investigations are very controlled. Major marijuana traffickers have been targeted in Eastern Kentucky.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The main speaker for the day was Fred Goins of the Franklin County Health Department. He spoke about the Public Health sector versus the Private Health sector. The Public Health sector is concerned with the preventive end of medicine which includes good nutrition and avoiding unhealthy habits like smoking. Public Health tries to assure that everyone has the opportunity to be healthy and live in a healthy environment. The composition of the Franklin County Health Board includes Judge Bob Arnold, Dr. Bob Rush, Mayor Houston Wells, Dr. Henry Leadingham, Dr. Scotty Green, Larry Montgomery, Dr. Roger Strunk and Pat Emberson. The Department has experienced tremendous growth in the last several years. It has a \$2.4 million dollar budget. While funding comes from state, federal and county governments, 55% of funding comes from fees for services. There were 57,000 services for 20,000 people last year. The Department has a diverse range of services and some services are provided by no other department outside Lexington and Louisville. There has been a 20% increase in people seeking health services in the last five years. With a grant from the state, a new building was built and Gary Scott was the architect. The new building has six exam rooms. The three major sections of the Health Department includes immunization and family planning, Environmental services such as
