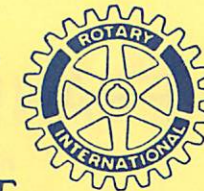

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for today was Dr. George Zack, Director of the Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra. He stated that when he started as conductor, there was a \$50,000 budget and five concerts a year. This year there is an \$850,000 budget and 40 concerts. Dr. Zack asked the question, "How important are the arts to you?" When public schools cut back their budgets, art programs are first to be terminated. However, music is very important to all our lives. Using background music enhances our retention which becomes longer and better. Dr. Zack has found no one who does not like music. Even if you do not play a musical instrument now, this does not mean that playing a instrument when you were growing up was not important. Music helps us in many other ways as well. Dr. Zack asked how many athletes we can remember before the turn of the century as opposed to how many artists we can name before the turn of the century. Society knows what is important and holds on to those things that last. When basketball is no longer played, Mozart will be. If you have never been involved in the arts before, it is never too late. We want our children to have something better than we had. Art is what man can be and what man aspires to be. Dr. Zack concluded his talk by saying, you must set your sights very high so that if you fall short, you will remember your goal as wonderful.

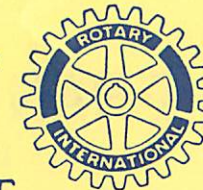

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Insurance agent Bob White spoke about Health Care Reform. He spoke from the standpoint of the agent. Insurance agents have a unique point of view as the link between the insurance company and the consumer. Agents educate their clients about benefits and continuing education is required. Small businesses are more numerous and are often subject to huge premium increases. Insurance companies are more conduits to pay claims for people incurring cost. If an insurance company is lucky, it will make a profit of 1% a year. Last year, health care costs were \$838 Billion which is 14% of our GNP. Shortfalls in payments by the government have to be made up in other ways. This is cost shifting. Advances in medical science and needless duplication as well as rising demand for services push costs up. Cost containment must be a major part of health care reform. Many uninsured persons choose not to cover themselves and or their dependents. Less than 10 Million people can be considered long term uninsured. Bob listed 8 ways we can improve health care.

- (1) We need cradle to grave coverage for everyone
 - (2) Cost control
 - (3) Portable and continuous coverage
 - (4) Preventive medicine
 - (5) No cancellation of coverage due to health status
 - (6) Choice must be made by the consumer and not government
 - (7) Role of government must be limited

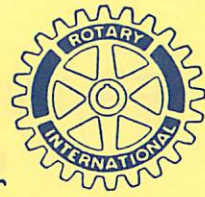

PolioPlus Plans 1992-93 Expenditures

At their October 1992 meeting, the Rotary Foundation Trustees approved a \$1 million grant to the People's Republic of China for 1993 special immunization days, and a two-year \$180,000 grant to Peru for continuing technical assistance for its "mop-up" operations. The PolioPlus program plans to spend more than US\$7.2 million to supply 74 countries with polio vaccine in 1992-93.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ABOUT ROTARY

Rotary has been commended for its work in childhood immunization in a front-page article in *The Christian Science Monitor* newspaper. The story, which appeared in the November 24 issue, gives an overview of recent strides and setbacks as the nations of the world face the care of their children.

Using the 1990 World Summit for Children as a reference point, reporter David Holmstrom addressed the critical issues of childhood disease, malnutrition and poverty, giving examples of progress that has been made in those areas.

When the summit met two years ago, Holmstrom stated, 80 percent of the world's children had been immunized after nearly a decade of effort. He quoted UNICEF spokeswoman Mehr Khan: "The joint effort by the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and various governments including Sweden, Canada, Italy, and others along with Rotary International helped achieve the goal."
