THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Mayor Huston "Ticker" Wells spoke of the State of the City. This year Frankfort has a \$12.6 million budget with \$1.4 million from the fund balance and \$5.6 million in reserves. Where does the money come from? (1) 60% from the occupational tax (2) 14% from property taxes (3) The fund balance (4) Rest from fees and permits. Where does the money go? (1) Public safety is 41% of \$5.5 Million for police and fire protection (2) Public works is 21% or \$2.6 million which includes sanitation, garbage and street repairs (3) Recreation department takes \$1 million (4) Capital improvements is \$1.4 million which includes an ecomomic development coordinator and is the only program designed to make money. Hopefully, this will cut back dependence on state employees. Also included is a centralized lab with a street call Sower Blvd! The lab takes 30 acres with 70 more acres for a research park. A spouse abuse office will also be funded. \$407 thousand has been set aside for a flood wall which is now in the president's budget for \$1.7 million. Work on the initial phase of the flood wall will begin next year and will run from Second Street School to the Old YMCA on Bridge St. some day the flood wall will be completed all the way to Murray St. Finally, capital Improvements will include the Jones Run pump station at the end of Holmes St. for drainage problems and funds to alleviate flooding in parts of Indian Hills. Problem flooding to be tackled in the future includes Bellpoint and West Frankfort.

MAKING STRIDES

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Carol Smock of the Workforce Development Office. This agency employs Rehabilitation Counselors and is the oldest state agency. The agency provided assistance to veterans originally and now assists disabled persons to become employed. Training is provided and a job coach will teach the person how to do a job. Physical and mental restoration is provid as well as placements. Carol gave four examples of persons who have achieved success but had disabilities. The counselor (1) takes the history of the person (2) Obtains records from schools and hospitals and doctors (3) Provides taining. Rehabilitation Engineering and Technology is very expensive. For example, there are computers which open doors and turn the lights on and off on verbal commands. However, most things done by the Workforce Development Office do not require this much money. Certainly the rehabilitation technology is less expensive than paying retirement benefits! Carol then gave several examples of people using various technologies devised by the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Cheryl Simpson and Carolyn Merrick of AT&T Kentucky Relay Service were the guests of the Frankfort Rotary Club for Wednesday, June 16, 1993.

Cheryl Simpson, AT&T Outreach Manager, has been deaf since birth. She explained to the club (through an interpreter) the uses of the Kentucky relay Service. this service, which has been in poeration since October 1991, allows deaf, hard-of-hearing and speech-impaired persons using a teletypewriter (TTY) - a specially designed device equipped with a keyboard and small screen - to hold telephone conversations with people who can hear. An AT&T communications assistant serves as a link between a hearing caller and a caller using a TTY. The assistant reads the TTY input to the hearing caller, then types a response to the TTY user.

The relay service handles more than 20,000 calls per month. There are no limits on the number or length of calls placed through the service. The service Keith Key handles both in-state and out-of-state calls. The cost of the TTY ranges from \$150-\$500 and calls to the relay service are toll-free. Service is provided by AT&T under contract to the Commonwealth of Kentucky Public Service Commission. The Kentucky Relay System is joined with the Virginia Relay Center for future service.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for today was Senator Walter Baker. He spoke about the "Silent Revolution" which has taken place between the legislature and the governor. In the 1960's, the legislature was a weak participant in the constitutional process. For example, one of Governor Breathitt's budget bills was approved in 10 minutes! The governor initiated, controlled and even voted on bills through legislators. If need be, he could veto. The interim committee system begun in the late sixties began. to change all that. We had new, bright and young legislators to come on the scene. The 1970's saw the continuing development of the maturity of the General Assembly. Appropriations and Revenue became a powerful committee. In December, 1975, a governor's budget was actually reduced. The 1979 legislative amendment changed the playing field . between the governor and legislature. new time schedule was developed so the legislature could override vetoes. Legislators were elected a year before the session with the new amendment so legislators would be more prepared for the session. Then we had a series of governors who were less possessive of the powers of the governor. For instance, Governor Brown took a "hands off" attitude while the legislature was putting "hands on". When Sen. Baker returned to the Senate in 1989, things had drastical ly changed. The Speaker of the House was all powerful.

Decisions are now made in the Democratic Caucus and on the third floor instead of the first. However, there have been some undesirable effects of a strong legislature. Legislators became more arrogant and there was a proliferation of subcommittees. We have some full-time legislators now and too many employees in the LRC. The Lt. Governor is no longer part of the legislative process. We need to reevaluate the balance between the governor and legislature. The FBI sting operation will lead power back to the governor. Unfortunately, many current members will not return because of the taint of corruption disclosed by BOPTROT While legislators make mistakes, the public is not well served by these continuing attacks on legislators by the press.




