THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Attorney General Chris Gorman. He stated that the primary goal of government is not education or economics development but to make sure people are safe in their homes and on the streets. We have governments to prevent anarchy. However, America is failing in that regard. Demagogues look for someone or something to blame like liberal judges and the welfare system. But the plain fact is that this young generation has less respect for human life than previous generations. The randomness of the violence is the most terrible thing of all. Kentucky is only one of 5 states where it is not a felony to have a gun in school. As a society, we cannot continue to be held hostage by the National Rifle Association. General Gorman has several legislative proposals for the upcoming General Assembly. The first is that there be no guns in school. Parents do not want to believe there is a problem but General Gorman is here to tell us there is indeed a problem. It is up to us to make sure our children do not face the problem of fear because of weapons in the schools. Secondly, he is proposing legislation to deal with the problem of accidental gun shootings. We talk alot about rights but not corresponding responsibilities. Gun owners must be held accountable for having a gun. Weapons simply must be secured. Finally, General Gorman spoke of the positive use of peer pressure. We must get the student leaders committed to this issue.

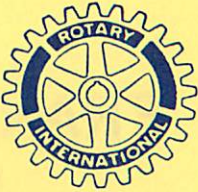

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Vic Hellard, executive director of the Legislative Research Commission, spoke to Rotary on the history of the Commission, from its founding in 1936 under Governor Chandler to its present day structure.

Until recently, the Commission was a mix of the legislative and executive branches, with the Governor having control of the legislature. During the Ford/Carroll years, LRC was modernized and the interim committee system was established and the functions of budget review process were given to the Commission. Hellard said that the interim committee system had a profound effect on the legislature and was the first and most import step on the road to legislative independence.

Hellard cited several areas of responsibility which have increased legislative importance, including the open meetings law, personal service contact committee, administrative regulation review committee, capital construction oversight committee, and education accountability as a result of the Kentucky Educational Reform Act.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Tom Bennett, Commissioner of Fish and Wildlife. 737,000 Kentuckians have fishing and/or hunting licenses. The Kentucky Afield show on KET is the most popular show of all. The host of the show is Dave Shuffett. His department is unique because all the money comes from hunting and fishing licenses and federal excise tax money and therefore is not affected by state budgetary cutbacks and is about \$14 million. However, his department is on a fixed income. Kentucky is losing hunters but gaining fishermen. It is often referred to as the "hook and bullets" agency. Unfortunately, there is less habitat available today. Consequently, the department is looking into non-traditional areas of outdoor activities in which to expand. The department needs to develop a broader constituency to people who care about wildlife but do not hunt and fish. Examples are birdwatching, campers, hikers and photographers. We need to start managing the habitat. There are many specialized groups which need to be brought together. For example, women who are heads of households need to be made more comfortable with the outdoors. Senior citizens are also being targeted. Since 95% of hunters hunt on private land, landowner relations are a priority. Partnerships with industry and environmental groups are needed. But past successes do not guarantee future successes.

On the plus side, all counties except Pike now allow deer hunting. Deer are now plentiful although poaching is a problem. 110 counties now allow turkey hunting. Kentucky has traded animals with other states. For example, in a trade with Louisiana, we got river otters and they got deer. The peregrine falcon has been introduced in Fayette Co. For persons born after 1975, a hunter safety program must be completed to obtain a hunting license. The future looks bright for wildlife in Kentucky.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our speaker was Dr. C Oran Little, from the University of Kentucky. He is Dean of the College of Agriculture, and Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station and the Cooperative Extension Service; assuming these positions in July 1988. Oran and his wife Myrtle have three daughters, all of whom are graduates of the U. of K. He believes that Food is what Brings People Together. We hear so much about how depressing the world is, but we should go back to our roots, and remember all the good things that have happened to us, and think of all the good things that are going to happen. Abe Lincoln made Thansgiving Day a national holiday, and signed into law the land grant college legislation, which allows ordinary people to purse a higher education. He discussed how land grant colleges EDUCATE, Experiment stations RESEARCH, and county Co-op agents DISTRIBUTE this combined knowledge. Today we see challenges in agriculture. Farmers are down to 2% of the population. Russia failed because people were tired of eating potatoes. Agriculture in Kentucky contribute \$12 -14 billion to the economy. 25 million acres are being farmed. There is now a comprehensive development plan created over the past several years; to help market our products; add value to our raw materials; better manage our human resources; and to finance the problems of agriculture. The U. of K. is addressing the problems of agriculture.

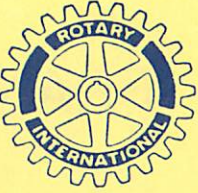
