THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Jan Arnow of the Department of Education who spoke about mult-cultural education issues. When asked waht Rotarians remembered as important issues of the day when they were 16, things mentioned were getting drivers licenses, Elvis, the Civil Rights movement, peer pressure, clothing etc. In a 1991 survey of 16 year olds, the first five topics were " AIDS, teen suicide, crack, abortion and racism. Missing from previous curriculums were women and minorities. This shows the importance of multi-cultural education. Goals of multi-cultural education are to affirm that all children are in all cultural groups. We must know ourselves before we can know others. We must value diversity and respect for persons with different backgrounds. Children must live fruitful lives in a culturally mobile society. The borders of countries today are constantly changing. We have to learn to like people who are not like ourselves. There are 5 areas of difference in mult-cultural education. (1) Race (2) Country of origin (3) Socio-economic status (4) Gender (5) Religion. Until recently, there was a lack of materials on mult-cultural education and now there is too much. These materials are on products everywhere because it is a hot topic. Children need to learn through mult-cultural education like we have learned to use seat belts and buy recyclable products.





THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our speaker was Dr. Thomas G. Boysen, Kentucky Commissioner of Education. With him was his Deputy Commissioner. He is a former Rotary Club President, and a Paul Harris Fellow. -- He brought out that Japanese students spend 40 hours a week in school and do twenty hours a week of homework, for a total of 60 hours The average Kentucky high school student spends 25 hours a week in school and does 5 hours a week of homework, for a total of 30 hours. Are we competitive today in a global economy? (He is a "nut" about homework.) In China, many schools run a business on the side, to have enough money to pay competitive salaries to the teachers. He asked Senator Walter Baker in the audience to think about this. He once coached a soccer team, and spent time teaching all the players various drills. But, when they played their first game, they had no sense of the game -- they only knew their drills. This is the way we've been teaching students, and what we want to change with KERA. In 1992-93, about 75% of the schools made progress. With accountability, schools that improve a given amount pay cash bonus's to the teachers, so he hopes this percentage wil improve this year. Overall, Kentucky is making terrific progress in their schools During Q&A, he brought out that in China, there is a selection process beginning in elementary school for students to go on to higher education. Possibly not a good thing. Also, under KERA, Parent involvement is important. Children shou-1d be a resource TO the family, not vice **NEXT WEEK'S PROGRAM** versa.


