

Darlene Urban of Capital Day School was today's Rotary speaker.

Since 1955, Capital Day School in Frankfort has offered traditional education blended with innovative teaching techniques. Students from pre-school (3 - 4 years of age) through the eighth grade receive an education with an accelerated curriculum, putting those students at least a school year ahead of students in public schools.

The school emphasizes good communication between faculty and parents, and considers the faculty-parent relationship as a support group that works toward meeting the educational needs of Capital Day's students.

In addition to its regular curriculum, the school offers curriculum in the fine arts, and adds athletics to academics in the form of basketball teams for boys and girls as well as cross-country and track teams.

The eighth grade class travels yearly to Key Largo, Florida where they enjoy learning about marine biology and marine ecology.



Our speakers were Amy Carman from the Kentucky Historical Society and our own fellow Rotarian Perry Ryan. The following is Perry's conclusion of the GSE trip to India.

In the days which have followed my return home from India, I have spent a great deal of time contemplating the entire experience. My journey has prompted me to take a closer look at myself and how I came to be upon a planet which supports billions of people besides myself. I have looked deeper at who I am and who I ought to be. I have sought answers to questions I dared not ask before. Bewildered by some of life's greatest mysteries. I have resolved to be a better person and to use the resources I have beeen blessed with having for the betterment of our world.

When I think of India. I think of pain and suffering. I think of filth, unsanitary food, and disease-causing water. I think of the starvation of the poor. I think how frightening it was that, even for a few weeks, medical care as I knew it in the United States was not available whenever I needed it. I think of a court system that was so antiquated that justice surely could not have been rendered. I think of a people whose personal identity is inseparable from that of the country in which they live.

On the other hand, when I think of India, I think of kindness and compassion. I think of the enormous.

time that parents spend with their child-Barry Holder, Jr. V ren. I think of a system of morals and conduct that controls crime, hatred, and violence, yet fosters love and concern. I think of love and sharing, of giving and caring. I think of an entire social order which concentrates its efforts not so much upon material possessions, but upon relationships. No other group of people ever treated me more hospitably than the Indian Rotarians who so selfessly gave of their time, money and energy, just to share with me a greater knowledge and understanding of their country. Their motives Barry Drury were varied and diverse, but I think most Indians, in a very silent, subtle way, know that they possess certain things more precious in the context of life than do other peoples of the world. Simplicity and humility are the trademarks of their great nation.

What factors separate one nation from another besides geography? The answer to this question will undoubtedly perplex me for the rest of my life. The answer is both simple and complex. My exodus to India challenged my most



Our speaker was Dr. Vince Davis, who recently retired as Associate Director of the Patterson School of Diplomacy at UK, and is an honorary Rotarian adopted by the Lexington club. He spent the morning shooting "free throws", hoping for a call for a trip to Knoxville. Receiving none, he spoke on his ideas of where the world is going in the area of depolmatic relations. He feels that since the cold war is over countries can no longer play the US against the USSR. Iraq has already started two wars, and will start a third. Iran is the biggest country in the mid-east with 60 million people, is muslim, but not Arabic. Saudi Aragia only has 5 million people. We should shift our attention from Japan to China. Hong Kong is propably the greatest center of trade in the world, every major US city has a "China Town". China has never been defeated by us, and won't take orders from us. Greatest short term problem -- RUSSIA. Yeltsin is forcing the Bosnian peace talks, but is not a member of NATO. Very difficult situation -- and hopeless. In 1994 -- a new role for the UN -- peace MAKING. Both sides of the Bosnian conflict WANT to fight, and are good fighters. Also in 1994, a new US president with NO strong background in international affairs. There is NO international activity in Arkansa. Little Rock is 2/3's the size of Lexington. Let's hope that his OJTworks out.


