The speaker for the day was Jill Robinson, Franklin County Magistrate. When she was running for public office, she was known as that girl from out of town since she moved here from Covington. Because of this fact, she began her campaign in January and worked hard meeting many people all the way until the election. She walked through the five city precincts twice. Most people do not know much about local government, she soon found out. Most people do not know much about what their city and county governments do. THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Rotary's speaker for the day was Gordon Boyd, the new Frankfort bureau reporter for WKYT-TV in Lexington.

Boyd, a Frankfort native, is the only fulltime Frankfort-based television reporter in the Lexington market. He said that it is difficult to sell comprehensive state government news to the public because the public wants its news in 30-second soundbites. The process and the outcome of issues within state government do not lend themselves to such brief descriptions.

Boyd had two goals: to make state government understandable to viewers; and to sell news directors and editors on the fact that state government news is more important than what can be told in 30-second soundbites.

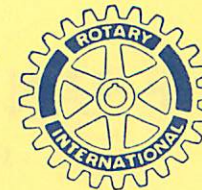

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Karen Caldwell, former United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Kentucky, was the special guest speaker of Frankfort Rotary Club for Wednesday, March 16, 1994.

Ms. Caldwell was appointed U.S. Attorney by President Bush in 1991. The U.S. Attorneys position is a presidential appointment and there are currently 93 throughout the country. The mission of the U.S. Attorney's Office is to enforce all federal laws and protect the public coffers through affirmative and defensive litigation. Basically, the U.S. Attorney's office provides a defense for federal offices that face litigation.

Ms. Caldwell explained how the federal government has "taken profit out of crime." When criminals are convicted there are several ways in which they "pay". Once fines are imposed at the district court level, these funds may be used to assist victims of crime with costs incurred by being a victim of criminal activity. Another use of these funds is to aid in the construction and maintenance of prisons. Through the Asset/Forfeiture program, states may seize the profits of criminals, i.e. drug dealers who have obtained vehicles, cars, homes and cash through their drug deals. This deprives criminals of the benefits of their illegal activities.

In conclusion, Ms. Caldwell discussed the three types of criminal activities that she wanted to target as U.S. Attorney: 1.) financial, health-care and banking fraud; 2.) combat

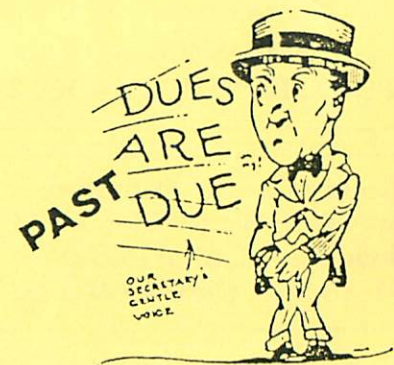

Our speaker was Earl Mackey, who has a long and impressive resume in the areas of legislatures. Although not a Rotarian, he has attended enough meetings to be one. on the subject of Ethics Reform, he reminded us that we as citizens are the "stockholders" of the state, and should be concerned about our investment. Based on the number of scandals on the national level, Kentuckians were ready for Ethics Reform even before BOPTROT. In February, legislature expenses were 4 million dollars. His committee is investigating where the money went. Definately, lobby events for the legislature were down. The process is more open. What we want to have is that WHAT you know is more important than WHO you know. Future of Ethics Reform? One side - many honest and dedicated individuals - on the other side - old politicians used to MONEY moving bills through the government. Problems: no pay raises in 8 to 10 years -- Full-time vs. Part-time -- serious question on how campaigns are financed. Over 50% of money in last campaign came from PAC's. -- The Kentucky Constitution allows for the Legislature to be guided by the Will of the People.
