Too many people confine their exercise to JUMPING to conclusions, RUNNING up bills, STRETCHING the truth, BENDING over backwards, LYING DOWN on the job, SIDESTEPPING responsibilities and PUSHING their luck.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM The speakers for today were fellow

Rotarians Frank Sower, Kurt Vezner and Ed Janeway. Frank Sower has known all Rotary Club presidents including the first president J. W. "Pat Ireland. He was superintendent of Frankfort Public Schools from 1918-1939. The Next Speaker was Kurt Vezner. In doing our financial planning we must be realistic and objective. Interest rates are rising and there are many changing economics in the world which affect us here in the U.S. In doing financial planning we do the opposite of paying taxes. We look at three areas when determining how much we have gained financially (1) Increase spendable income (2) Reduce the impact of taxes on our income and estate (3) Increase net worth. We look where to put our money like in (1) Cash reserves (2) Insurance (3) Fixed assets (4) Things you own like stocks, bonds and cars. To be successful in financial planning we want to (1) Find someone you trust (2) Take an inventory of what is your income and budget (3) Set short term, intermediate and long term goals and set out to reach these goals. What is happening with the stock market should not cause panic if you have a proper financial plan. You need a tax strategy and a will to pass on your assets with the least impact. 50% of Americans are concerned about their financial well-being. Ed Janeway said that the laws of supply and demand applies to money. Demand for money causes interest rates to go up. Oil prices are a good standard to determine the cost of money and economic



J.W. "PAT" IRELAND FELLOWSHIP

After several years of deliberation concerning a "flagship" project for the Frankfort Rotary Club, the Frankfort Potary Youth Fund was established on Iec. 14, 1993. The primary purpose of the fund is to establish and fund programs to benefit the youth of Frankfort and Franklin County. The first project undertaken by the fund is to provide three \$1000 scholarships — one each to students in each of our high schools to be used for the 1994—95 school year.

The J. W. "Pat" Ireland foundation has been eastablished as a funding mechanism for the Frnakfort Rotay Youth Fund. The foundation is named for the first President of the Frankfort Rotary Club. Pat Ireland was a noted educator in Frankfort having served as school superintendent from 1918 to 1939.

At the April 13 Rotary meeting, President John Palmore was inducted as the first Pat Ireland fellow. Frank Sower, who has been a club member since 1933 was alo inducted as a charter Pat Ireland fellow.

Charter foundation membership requires a \$500 contribution to the Frankfort Rotary Youth Fund to be paid on or before May 18, 1994.



THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker was Dr. Mary Smith. president of Kentucky State University. She is a native of Mississippi, a mother and a grandmother. Dr. Smith is most appreciative of the support we have given KSU -- and our new scholarship foundation. She stated that we are a "Nation at Risk" if we do not improve our education system. As a community, it is important that we suport KSU. Why? it is the second largest employer in Frankfort; it is an IN-TOWN university; it increases the number of college graduates in Frankfort. (Families with at least one college degree earn 75% more than families without.) KSU opened in 1886 with 55 students, 3 professors, and an annual budget of \$3,000. Their land cost \$1,500 and the first building cost \$7,000. They have developed an Aqua-culture program to be proud of, and are doing joint research with the Peoples Republic of China. Their goals: (1) to increase marketing of what they have to offer; (2) recruit students: (3) raise schlorarship money: and (4) have the business community offer internships to students, with the interns writing a proposal to the business showing how the intern can help the business.


