THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speakers for the day were David Taylor and David Burke of the Coalition of Committed Christians. The corporation runs the Soup Kitchen and Homeless Shelter located on West Second Street. It is just plain wrong for people to go hungry in a nation and community as rich as ours. The Soup Kitchen gives some people their only hot meal of the day. The goal is education and make Franklin Countians aware of the needs of these people. In 1984 the Soup Kitchen was set up. It was started by the Capital City Christian Church and at first there no takers. However, the efforts continued and a shelter was rotated from church to church. David Burke then spoke about seeing several homeless people in Frankfort. At first he was told the program would not be successful. The answer is not only will that dog now hunt but the fox has been treed. The Coalition consists of some 100 volunteers, 22 churches and several civic groups. The day program is open Monday through Friday from 11:30 till 1:00. The food is processed on site and is a licensed restaurant. On Saturday it is open from 11:30 till 12:30. On Sunday both physical and spiritual bodies are feed with devotional services and a meal and the shelter is open at 2:00. The night program accomodates temporary and life-style transients. It is a temporary emergency shelter and is open year round. About 45 people are in the day program. The objective is to feed and house people in a safe, quiet





WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ABOUT ROTARY

Philippine President Fidel W. Ramos was the guest of honor and keynote speaker at a special 75th anniversary celebration of the Rotary Club of Manila in January.

Mr. Ramos declared June as "Philippine Rotary Month" in honor of Asia's first and one of its largest Rotary clubs. In signing a proclamation to that effect, he said, "The Rotary Club of Manila, during its 75 years of existence, has embarked on many community-oriented projects which have left their imprint on our society and have touched the lives of thousands among our poor and disadvantaged."

The Manila club's first-in-Asia status will get special mention at the 1994 RI Convention in Taipei. In a letter to the 1993 RI Convention in Melbourne, President Ramos wrote, "Rotary's enduring spirit of volunteerism that transcends the boundaries of geography, creed and color illuminates the darkness of apathy, prejudice and alienation in the world today."

WOMEN ROTARIANS TAKE ON NEW LEADERSHIP ROLES

In 1987, a U.S. Supreme Court ruling caused Rotary International to open its doors to women. Since then, the number of Women Rotarians has grown rapidly and today their numbers top 52,000 worldwide. In the past two years alone, female membership has increased by one third.

But women's impact on Rotary is not limited to membership figures. Women are not only club members, but important club leaders.

From the onset, women have made a significant contribution to their clubs by chairing committees or spearheading important community service initiatives. And thousands of women have held the office of club president or other club leadership positions.

Women are also now starting to be recognized for their contributions. Dr. Saowalak Rattanavich, a member of the Rotary Club of Bangrak, Thailand, is the first women Rotarian to receive the prestigious Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. Dr. Rattanavich-who was also the first woman Rotarian in Thailand—was recently awarded the citation mainly for her work in the field

of literacy. Her idea led to the creation of a successful literacy project which received a Rotary Foundation Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) grant.

Another victory for female Rotarians was this year with the nomination of several women district governors for 1995-96. Candidates for district governor must have been Rotarians for at least seven years by the time they take office, so this is the first year women are eligible to be nominated for district governor.




