THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was County Judge Bob Arnold who spoke about the State of the County. This year Franklin County has a balanced budget and this is the fifth straight year we have added to surplus. Concerning Lakeview Park, Expo kicked off there this year with 23 hot air balloons. Two pavilions have been completed as has 2 of 4 mile walking and jogging trail. The County Fair will be held there the week of July 19 with a Demolition Derby and tractor pull. A family golf complex will be built with a 9 hole golf course, driving range and 18 hole miniature golf course. This will include historic sites in Franklin County. In the area of economic development, we need opportunities for high school and college graduates. The County is presently searching for an Executive Director to recruit new businesses and promote tourism.

Concerning the Health Department, we have one of the tops in the region. A new \$800,000 building has been built. The Department provides 53,000 services to 27,000 people. Farmers-Home grants have gone to 170 households without safe drinking water. There are now less than 300 families without drinking water. In the area of fire protection there are 4 new stations. Sewers have been extended. December 7, 1994 will mark Franklin County's Bicentennial. On May 13, 1995 stump speaking will be brought back to Franklin County. Activities are planned for the Bicentennial.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Dr. Arthur Frank, Chairman of the Department of Preventive Medicine and Environmental Health at UK's College of Medicine addressed Rotary about the emerging issues in environmental health and occupational medicine. He said that safe and healthy workforce benefits everyone - community, family, employer and employee alike.

There are four major areas of concern dealing with environmental health:
1. Air Indoor air quality is of major concern, especially as it concerns the effects of second-hand smoke.

2. Water Clean drinking water is crucial to survival, and water is in short supply in such areas of the U.S. as the western half of the nation.

3. Land Use of land for waste - household garbage to nuclear and chemical wastes - is of utmost concern.

4. Food supply Although food supply is abundant in this country, we are dealing with issues that effect the food supply, such as use of pesticides and chemicals that produce bigger and better food.

The workplace is facing a different set of issues because of the make-up of the workforce: The tremendous rise of numbers of women in the workforce has brought such issues to the forefront as health care and adequate day care. Health care is again a concern with an increase in an aging workforce. The workplace is now more sensitive to those with disabilities and finally, a growing number of children and youth in the workforce, brought about by school-to-work programs.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Jack C. Lewis, Commissioner of the Corrections Department was the guest speaker for Wednesday, June 15, 1994. Commissioner Lewis is responsible for the day-to-day operations of 12 adult prisons (which house over 10,600 individuals); 3 private prisons; 73 jails and 15 "hold-over" facilities.

Specific programs working within the correctional facilities include: (1) Educational programs - this includes programs for those inmates needing adult literacy, adult basic education and the GED program. College and vocational/technical programs are also available. Approximately 2,000 inmates are receiving some kind of educational program.

(2) Mental health programs - this includes a 90-day intensive substance/alcohol abuse program. 73% of all inmates have a history of substance/alcohol abuse during the time they committed the crime for which they are currently incarcerated.

(3) Sex Offenders program - 10% of all Kentucky prisoners are in jail for a sex offense. This program is a very intensive 24 month program instituted prior to their release. There is also a 18 month follow-up component that they must participate in as a probationary requirement.

(4) Boot Camp program - This program began in 1993 through a federal grant. Modeled after "marine corps boot camp" it is 120 days of hard work, discipline, and intense educational focus. This program is designed for nonviolent offenders.

(5) Correctional Industries program - inmates are responsible for the production of goods which are sold statewide and produce a revenue of over 1 million dollars for the Corrections Department. (6) Farm Program - Commissioner Lewis' personal favorite - inmates farm over 6,000 acres across the state. Inmates in Boyle, Fayette, Lyon and Oldham counties are responsible for crops, hogs and cattle which brings in approximately \$500,000 a year.

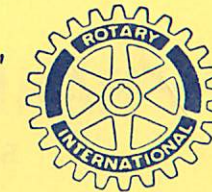

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The program opened with a song by members of the cast of "The King & I", being presented by the Bluegrass Theatre Guild. Our speaker was Kim Burse, Secretary of the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet (KRC), who presented the KRC Strategic Plan for 1994-1997. She is both a C.P.A. and a Certified Cash Manager; the first female African-American to serve in a cabinet level position; and holds a bachelor and a masters degrees from U.K. After a short story about how bodies floating down a river relate to state government, she stressed that Kentucky can no longer afford to simply REACT to crisis, but must PLAN for the future. The first step is to diagnose the problems. (1) The tax structure itself (2) Tax Administration (3) Tax Gap (defined as the difference between what the law says should be collected, and what actually is collected). The KRC currently administers 52 different taxes, licenses, etc. One answer to help taxpayers is better education about the system. As an example, farmers who sell hay to be eaten by cows that are destined for human consumption DON'T pay sales tax, but farmers who sell hay to be eaten by horses DO pay sales tax. This is a hard law for hay farmers to comply with. The mission of the KRC is to "Provide courteous, accurate and efficient services for the benefit of Kentucky and its citizens, and administer the tax laws of the Commonwealth in a fair and impartial manner". To help reduce the level of non-compliance -- working with the IRS

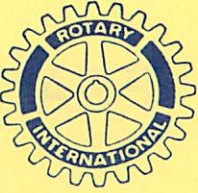
