THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Nicky Hughes of the Kentucky Historical Society who spoke about the 200th Anniversary of Franklin County. He was asked by Judge Bob Arnold to chair the event. On December 7, 1794, by enactment of the legislature, Franklin County was created. This county was created out of Mercer, Shelby and Woodford Counties. In turn, Anderson, Owen and Gallatin Counties were created out of Franklin County. The Act of the legislature took effect May 10, 1795. The three original counties came together at the point where Benson Creek comes in the the Kentucky River and in December 1994 a marker stating this fact will be erected. The main observance will be on May 13, 1995. An old-fashioned barbecue and political rally will be held on that date in Frankfort which idea was long ago stolen by Fancy Farm. This will be rejuvenated in Frankfort to coincide with the May election. Rotarian Jim Richardson will recreate the return of the Boones to Frankfort from Missouri. This will include a trip up the Ohio River with ceremonies at the Old Capitol. From there, the procession will proceed with pomp and circumstance to the Frankfort Cemetary. There will also be a pagent at the Franklin County Fair and a living history program. A marker will be dedicated on the history of the railroads. Ben Franklin, after whom the county was named, will be portrayed by a well-known local character. A calendar will show historical images. Frank Sower and

ROTARY PROGRAM FOR WEDNESDAY, JULY 20th

Tom Fugate with the Kentucky Historical Society will speak on the exhibit "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition" which is on display at the Old Capital Annex. The phrase was popularized by a Presbyterian minister from Murray, Kentucky, Howell Forgy, who was a chaplain on board the U.S.S. New Orleans at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. Because ministers were forbidden to take up arms, he walked among the sailors during the Japanese attack encouraging the men to "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition." The expression quickly became a rallying cry for American servicemen around the world.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Tom Fugate of the Kentucky Historical Society spoke about the exhibit now showing at the Old Capital Annex, "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition." The exhibition was developed two years ago to coincide with the 50th Anniversary of World War II. Because of Kentucky's Bicentennial, the exhibit was put off until the D-Day celebrations. The exhibit officially opened on June 3 with a \$65,000 grant from the Department of Defense. Tom asked what happened 50 years ago today and he responded that it was the anniversary of the attempt to assassinate Hitler. The exhibit lets one look back on the way life was back then. The phrase was coined by a Presbyterian minister from Murray, Kentucky, Howell Forgy, who walked among the sailors aboard the U.S.S. New Orleans. It soon became a World War II battle cry. There is a world map in the exhibit which allows you to look at the global picture as it was then. There is an exhibit on the liberation of the Phillipines. There are on display uniforms from all branches of the armed forces. The Italian campaign is also depicted with a German motorcycle and a jeep. There is also an exhibit on the home front. There are scenes of the migration of Eastern Kentuckians to more industrialized areas to work in defense plants. The Depression was brought to a close but there was not much to spend money on due to rationing. 306,000 Kentuckians served which

was 2% of all servicemen. 7,902 Kentuckians gave their lives with 5,154 killed in action. Tom concluded his talk by saying the Exhibit is dedicated to fallen Kentuckians and their families.
