THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our speaker for the September 7, 1994 Rotary meeting was Virginia Fox, Executive Director & CEO of KET.

She is a graduate of Morehead, has a Masters from UK, and did post gradute work at Harvard.

Her discussion centered around three primary functions that KET performs.

The first function is that of "Education". Seventy five percent of Franklin County students receive credits from satellite broadcasts. Seven thousand college students receive credit. She also pointed out that GED graduates make \$3000 more per year than those without a degree.

The second function is to "Preserve Kentucky's Cultural Heritage". Many original programs about Kentucky are created at KET.

The third function is to encourage a "Sense of community". They try to get people to do good for themselves and to concentrate on similarities.

She went on to say the average tax payter pays four dollars in taxes for KET while the price for under education will cost much more.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The guest speaker at Rotary on September 14, 1994 was Rotarian, Ron Tyrer, who spoke on Health Care Reform. Ron addressed the issue from the nattional, state and local perspective. On the national level, he and many others believe nothing much beyond some insurance reform will take place before next year. Although it is a very complex issue that most want to see add-pressed and the Clinton administration has managed to keep it in the limelight, a recent Gallop poll shows 61% reponding wanting to postpone the decisions until 1995.

Health Care Reform is an on-going process. According to Ron, Kentucky is no exception to the national trend. Kentucky's key piece of health care legislation, passed during the last session, is HB 250. Ron noted different provisions of the bill and discussed in more detail two key provisions; the Health Care Policy Board and the Health Purchasing Alliance. The Health Care Policy Board is an independent agency of state government with powers that include collection of data, development of a uniform medical and dental claim form, developing of standard health benefit plants and approved of supplemental plans, oversight of the health care puchasing alliance, and review and approval of certificate of need applications. The Health Purchasing Alliance includes the entire Commonwealth and is the only entity permitted to operate as a statewide health purchasing alliance Membership is mandatory for state employees and Medicaid recipients effective July 15, 1995 and many other sate and local government and quasi-government groups on Jan. 1, 1996.

The purpose of this groups is to negotiate and contract with health plans to get the best price for persons covered and ensure all areas are adequately covered.

Mr. Tyrer's further state-level comments covered the "Buy-In" Health Care Program which is now available (800-295-8898), recent newspaper articles regarding provider reimbursements and reductions in Medicaid rembursements, the Discount Option Program for eligible persons who are under 200% of the federal poverty guidelines and the provider tax. Ron expressed his concerns and particularly that the provider tax will impact the number of physician's willing to come and to stay in Kentucky.

On the local scene, Ron noted that we have a shortage of Primary Care Physicians, but said we have what seems to be the needed number of Specialists. Problemmatic is the rate of care received in emergency rooms by Medicaid recipients. It seems that for many recipients, it is the only way to access care. Since this is the most expinsive form of health care, Ron and the local Department for Medicaid Services staff are working to address the problem.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Dr. Charles T. Wethington, President of the University of Kentucky, was the guest speaker of the Frankfort Rotary Club for Wednesday, September 21, 1994.

Dr. Wethington was named President of the University of Kentucky in September 1989. Since his tenure began, Dr. Wethington has been working to recruit the best students and faculty to the University of Kentucky. His pursuits in attracting the best and brightest to the University of Kentucky is evident. This Fall the freshman class totaled approximately 2,650. Of those enrolled, there are 82 National Merit Scholars, 135 Governor's Scholars, 106 Valedictorians and an expanded Honor Program.

In recruiting the best undergraduates, you must also have quality faculty and facilities. The University of Kentucky has an excellent faculty but is always actively searching for quality instructors from across the coutry.

Another key to academic success involves the construction of the new University of Kentucky library. This state-of-the-art facility will serve as a communications mecca for the entire state. Dr. Wethington outlined his plan to secure other sources of revenue in order to begin construction of the library in November 1994. Those revenue sources include the Lexington/Fayette County Urban Government, The University of Kentucky's National Alumni Associtation and revenues from the University of Kentucky's Athletic Association.

Thank you Dr. Wethington for your continued leadership in making the University of Kentucky an institution of higher learning dedicated to the pursuit of excellence.

We welcome the newest member of our club, Chris Hill. Chris was introduced by Henry Leadingham, His classification will be Civil Law.

THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our speaker was Judge Joseph M. Hood, one of 4.5 judges in the Eastern Federal District of Kentucky. He is a graduate of U.K., and a Rotarian. Judge Hood has developed a reputation as a firm, but fair, judge. When he became a judge 4 years ago, sitting in Pikeville and Frankfort, he was told that Frankfort would have the lighter case load. That was before BOPTROT. The most common cause of crime some years ago was poverty -- today it is "Past Abuse" (It's not my fault"). He isn't seeing any acceptance of responsibility for the misdeeds of the people who appear before him. Other excuses are alcoholism and drug withdrawal. During Q&A, he gave an informative explanation of the Federal sentencing guidelines and why sentences can seem to vary widely for what appears to be the same crime -- especially if the defendent gave "substantial assistance" to the government. Judge Hood firmly believes in the jury system, but does believe jury members have overdosed on television. Sentencing guidelines so allow for fines to recover the cost of incarceration and parole. He believes in the media, and their right to show that he is not running a star chamber. On the other hand, they shouldn't take over the judicial system.
