THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

The speaker for the day was Joseph T. Burch, Vice President for University Relations with the University of Kentucky. He stated that in only five years the University has gone from 12 to 82 National Merit Scholars. However. he asked us to look behind the numbers and look at the historical perspective as to what this means to Kentucky. UK has always fostered a quality education to students who apply themselves. UK was founded 130 years ago as a Land Grant college. The GI bill allowed many servicemen to attend. In the 1960's, there was raped growth in facilities and the student body. At that time, all high school graduates were accepted but one third of the freshman class was lost. There was a concern that precious resorces were being wasted as well. Therefore, in 1980, the University became a selective admissions institution. UK needed to attract the best students and to do this UK needed to become the best institution possible. Success could not have come were it not for the community college system. UK began recruiting students for the first time and aggressively went after the best students in the state. The honors program was enhanced and the size of the freshman class was limited. UK continued to recruit the best faculty members. A decade later, we are seeing the results of this investment. This year, UK has 135 Governors Scholars and 106 high school valedictorians. SAT scores continue to climb and are above the national level. UK is in the top 10 in public universities and the top 25 of all institutions of higher learning. However, this did not happen overnight and or by accident. This is important

because if students go out of state, many do not come back. \$100 million has come to Kentucky as the result of research grants attracted by the faculty. Out of 135,000 alumni, 25,000 are active in the Alumni Association. UK alumni are very loyal to their school.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dr. Stempel of the Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce at U.K. As the Cold War ended, we look more to the U.N. to end the fighting and less to the U.S. as an international policeman. Today, the United Nations tackles religious and ethnic issues although due to its composition is often accused of partisanship. The U.N. missions are not given the authority to carry out their objectives. The U.N. often does not have a deep commitment from member states. There are three rules of thumb wich must be considered when deciding for the U.N. or U.S. to intervene. (1) We should only act if significant interests are at stake which includes refugee and political issues. (2) We should only act when we can do something and make it stick. (3) We should only act if we have the support of other countries who have more at stake than we do. One example is in Haiti where the interest is to stem the refugee flow. Regional cooperation must be increased. Human rights must be supported there. This was also a situation which was doable but should have been done a year ago. The OAS nations were all on board in this one. Haiti was a careful use of force in support of diplomacy. Regarding the Iraq/Kuwait crisis (son of Gulf War) Saddam shot himself in the foot again and is careful not to push the U.N. across the line. Rose Hayden then spoke about NAFTA. Today all economies are international and all business is non-national. She startled us all by saying there is no trade deficit

since 81% of our economy is service instead of manufacturing and when services is considered (and it is underreported,) Nancy Edwards we really have trade surplus. NAFTA has benefited 365 million people and this represents a \$6 trillion economy. NAFTA is the only free trade agreement between a developed and developing country.

NAFTA is not an event but is an on-going process. It all started with the US-Canada Auto Pact in 1965. U.S. corporations are vastly increasing their sales. 30 million Mexicans are in the consumer middle class. Trade is linked with prosperity. Kentucky businesses should take advantage of all the opportunities created by NAFTA. For example, Americans can own Mexican banks in 12 years. There are also many opportunities in the fields of petro-chemicals and insurance.




