THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was District Governor Steve Shultz. He stated that as the representative of Rotary International, he acts as a counselor, facilitator and helper. The next district governor will be a woman so we are a very progressive district. Governor Steve's aim is to further the objects of Rotary to all Rotarians. He implored the Club to read the objects of Rotary in their Rotarian. Governor Steve discussed his meeting with the Rotary leadership prior to the regular meeting and was very impressed with our Club's many successful and special projects. He particularly noted the Shadowing program. Paul Harris Fellowship, the Pat Ireland foundation and Interact. He promised to share our success stories with other clubs he will visit. 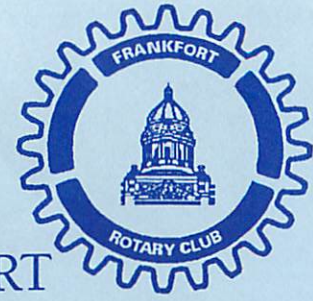

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Governor Julian Carroll provided Rotary with his analysis of the November 8 election. In a humorous manner, he indicated that he "saw the train coming". He said seriously that this election was probably one of the most honest elections ever in Kentucky. He also said you'll always have someone trying to manipulate elections. The fact that the results of the election reflects the attitudes of the voters does make him feel good.

On the analytic side, the Governor noted that yesterday's elections did not characterize the qualifications of candidates as they had in the past. The vote cast, according to him, was a vote "against" and not a vote "for". This vote "against" was the result of two prevailing attitudes and the influence of the increasingly conservative media. First, the business people are frustrated with government and their difficulties in making a profit; second, the taxpayers are upset that taxes are up and it seems like the folks not working are doing about as well as they are; third, the media considers that attitudes of the populace and projects these attitudes through its programming which brings the marginal observers around to these attitudes, resulting in a vote "against" everything. Governor Carroll also noted that the results of yesterday's election is probably a good thing, saying it should wake up the Democratic party.

Looking toward the near future, Governor Carroll said that beginning January, 1995, everyone will be looking only toward the 1996 Presidential election. He says we will see a lot of legislative investigative hearings in late

1995 since the Republicans no longer have to ask. He also indicated that results of the hearings will be just in time for the election.

Governor Carroll noted that Kentucky Democrats have a history of voting conservative and said he wished the national Democratic party was more conservative. Again, yesterday indicated the voters want to see less government. He commented that the national Democratic trends have also left the conservatively Democratic South, adding that this is a result of the nomination process. Governor Carroll says we should return to the Convention process.

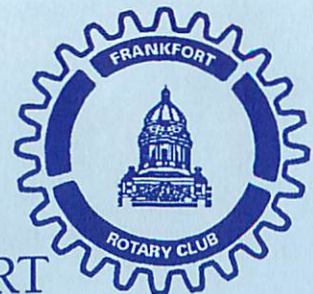

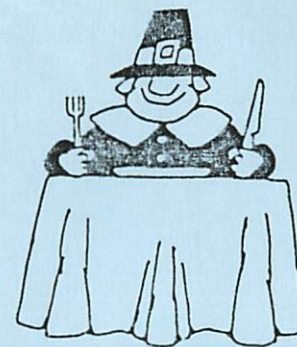

PAY ATTENTION TO VISITORS

Have you ever visited a club where
you were pretty much ignored, left out
of table conversation, or treated like an
outsider? Don't let our visitors get this
impression from us! Here are a few
ideas to help make our time of fellow-
ship the best it can be:

- * Sit in a different part of the room
every week. This new perspective
and different neighbors will help
you get to know other members bet-
ter.
- * Make an effort to properly greet visi-
tors near you. Learn their name and
find out their classification. How
does their classification relate to
yours? Make connections and a new
friend. After all, Rotary was origi-
nally devised as a business network-
ing activity which expanded into
public service.
- * Keep the "insider chatter" to a mini-
mum when visitors sit with you.
They feel left out of this type of
conversation and have nothing to
contribute. Springboard from clas-
sification exchange to mutual or
overlapping topics. Everyone may
learn something from such ex-
changes. Ask questions and listen
to others.
- * Ask visitors about their club projects
or how they conduct meetings. Va-
riety in how meetings are conducted
adds spice to an otherwise boring
buffet. If an idea sounds interesting,
mention it to, or, better yet, write it
down for a board meeting.
Let's make more than an effort to be
the friendliest club in the district:
treat our visitors like royalty. They
will remember us the next time they
need to make up a meeting.

THE KEY IS COMMITMENT

Attendance. Why is it important? Here are
some reasons. Attendance reflects commitment,
demonstrates involvement, fuels success. It is a
barometer of the strength of each Rotary Club,
and strong attendance is both a consequence of
and a stimulus to good meetings, good fellow-
ship and successful projects. Poor attendance
can both reflect and cause weakness in all areas
of club activities and goals. Think of the differ-

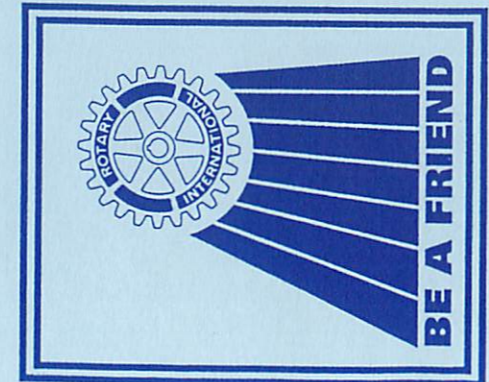

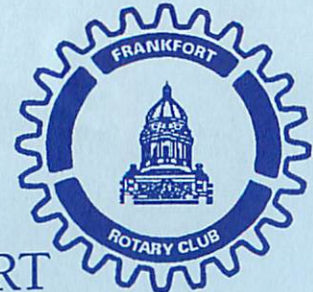

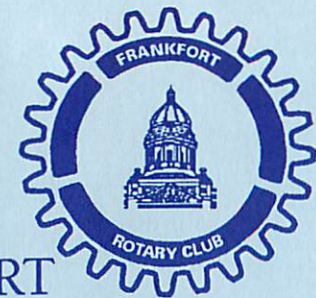

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Miles A. Bailey, Rotary District Representative at the Council on Legislation on revising the Rotary International Constitution in Caracas, Venezuela. There are some 148 matters to be considered at the session which will convene on January 25 which is like a Congress and Constitutional convention combined. This body meets every 3 years. Any proposed enactment must go through the District of which there are 506 representatives. Three minutes are allowed by the proposer with two minutes for each speaker. A voice vote is then taken or a standing vote if it is close. The Bill Sargeant votes if there is a tie. It takes a 2/3 vote to change the Constitution and a simple majority to change the by-laws. Resolutions will be proposed to change the Manual of Procedure. Miles spoke about both frivolous and serious proposed changes. Among the frivolous proposals is to allow retirees to join Rotary when they have not been members previously and have no classification. Another proposal would be to make Rotary songs gender neutral. Among the serious proposals would be to redefine the duties of the R.I. president. Another proposal would abolish some committees and have sunset laws for committees when they have served their purpose. The rezoning proposal may be controversial. This would require 34,000 Rotarians per zone. The purpose of rezoning would be to provide equal representation of the R.I. Board of Directors. The Manual of Procedure hopefully will be codified to make it easier to find rules in it.

Another controversial proposal will be to gear the local dues to the GNP of the respective countries which will be popular with Third World countries for obvious reasons but it would mean our dues would increase substantially. Other proposals would affect attendance requirements and allow for the transfer of club membership.
