#### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dr. George Shields, professor of philosophy at Kentucky State University. His talk was on recent perspectives on the problems of evil in our world. The traditional theory is that God is benevolent God is omnipotent. But since evil and suffering exist in this world, a benevolent and omnipotent God cannot exist. In response, Dr. John Hicks has written a book entitled Evil and the God of Love He states that the first above premise is false and that God does not wish to eliminate all evil and suffering. Evil is necessary to develop moral traits. For example, Alfred Lord Tennyson wrote The Land of the Lotus Eaters. In his book, nothing bad could ever happen to anyone but no one could develop moral virtues in such a system. There must be dangers, risks and adversities to be overcome. The virtue of compassion could not be developed in such a system where eveil is not overcome. The problem is that this theory forgets the subhuman animal kingdom. Dr. Griffin by contrast writes of process theology in his book God. Power and Evil. He sees the problem with the second premise. Even if God is omnipotent, evil still could not be eliminated. Any genuine individual has some degree of freedom. By this theodicy, any universe God would create would have some degree of causal efficacy. A benevolent God wou-1d be boring without high aestetic value but this universe would be complex with many competing interests and entities in it. Anything else would be boring without high aestetic values. There would be inevitable conflicts with different lines of interests. It would

be impossible to eliminate the possibility of evil. For example, cancer is not inherently or intrinsically evil but only becomes so when competing with the interests of normal cells. A third theodicy is found in Professor George Schlesinger's book, Religion in the Scientific. He borrows from St. Thomas Aguinas who wrote that there is no human intelligible answer because of the existence of infinity. God being God can entertain an infinite number of possibilities. Answers reside in the infinite image of God. God's thoughts are transcendent. The presence of plausible theodicies is comforting. Finally, Dr. Shields distinguished between moral evil (Hick's theory) and natural evil (Griffin's theory) Moral evils involve conscious choices while natural evils involve elements of ordered chance like an earthquake or tornado. Dr. Shield's does not endorse any of these theodicies to the exclusion of the other but posits them for discussion.

#### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker on December 14, 1994 was Malcomb Kilduff. Mr. Kilduff had a long and distinguished civil service career in Washington. Many of those years were spent in the State Department, but in 1959, he went to work for the Bureau for Public Affairs where he oversaw the briefing papers for the Presidents' Press Conferences. Mr. Kilduff said when John Kennedy became President, Press Conferences changed; they were live for the first time and JFK answered his own questions, the Public Affairs folks only anticipated the questions.

Mr. Kilduff is probably known most around the world as the man that told us our President, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, had been assassinated on November 22, 1963. Mr. Kilduff had been appointed Assistant Press Secretary to Pierre Salinger in 1962 and had traveled with the Kennedys to Dallas.

The trip to Dallas had been planned to heal the Democratic party split in Texas. This trip was right on the heels of the Cuban missile crisis and this was the first domestic political trip for Mrs. Kennedy since 1960. Everyone was comming to see the Kennedys. There was no Goldwater reaction as anticipated in Dallas, but we all know what did happen.

Mr. Kilduff was in the third car in the motorcade and says he heard the first shot. He thought it was a holiday firecracker; then he saw the scurry of secret service agents. He saw the open window at the Book Depository. He Continued...


still didn't know the President was shot. When the motorcade started picking up speed, he thought they might be going to the airport; not the hospital.

Mr. Kilduff showed us the video of the announcement of President Kennedy's death.

Interesting and revealing comments made by Mr. Kilduff:

- .. Many theories abound about JFK's assassination because people do not want to believe the President is so vulnerable that he can be shot so easily.
- ..Believes Oswald was after Connelly, not JFK.
- ..Belives that Johnson and Nixon are to blame for the adversarial relationship of the Press and the Presidents—they lied to the press and used the press.


