THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Rotary guest speaker on January 11, 1995 was Dr. Thomas C. Boysen, Commissioner of Education. Dr. Boysen, who is not a stranger to Frankfort Rotary, again gave a very informative presentation. Highlights from his presentation are:

--Children in Kentucky are writing alot more now than prior to KERA. They are writing meaningfully about an idea and are supporting it. University freshmen are not as afraid of writing as they were.

-- The "basics" are being covered.

--Schools are now held accountable for students' learning. In turn, students are being taught they are responsible for their own learning.

--Kentucky has had a favorable increase in its comparison to the national averages. The 92-94 biennium report will be released February 7. 26 million dollars will be awarded to local schools.

--There has been a 20% increase in academic achievement during the past two years.

From the Question and Answer Period, we learned:

--Schools will begin paying attention to Arts and Humanities as there are now relative measures in the tests.

--Dr. Boysen supports a longer school year, but doesn't know how to pay for it.

--The Education and Professional Standards Board are about to complete a plan for results oriented teacher certification.

--Kentucky has 50 out of 1400+ schools in decline.

--Teachers are very much a part of the reform process with 850 schools now having school-based decision making councils.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dr. Roland Haun, President of the American Association of School Administrators. He spoke of his trip to Russia where he met with the Minister of Education where they are just as concerned about their children as we are. He was told that Russia is like a forest and the only people aware of the winds of change there are at the very top. He then spoke about the myth that test scores are going down. A report prepared on public schools which was prepared during the Bush administration but suppressed because it was too positive showed that in the 1950's and early 1960's, 75% of students dropped out of high school because a high school degree was not necessary for most well paying jobs. However, today when a high school diploma is essential to a decent job, 85% of students are staying in high school and graduating. Therefore, in the 1950's only 25% or the cream of the crop were taking college entrance board exams. Today, many more students are taking college boards. When the top 25% of today's students are compared with the top 25% that tooke it in the 1950's test scores soared. In addition, the exams are more difficult today. As to the charge that there are too many administrators, between 1960 and 1990, superintendents were reduced by 62% mostly due to school district mergers. Central office positions were reduced by 35%. While the ideal ratio between administrators and those being supervised is 7-1, the ratio is 20-1 in our schools. There are fewer people in administration today but there is an increased workload. The public schools are doing an excellent job of educating

but we are having trouble getting that message out.

In responding to questions from the floor, Dr. Haun made these observations:

- (1) KERA is working well although some changes are needed. He supports site-based management
- (2) High schools must be restructured which was not covered by KERA
- (3) Kentucky's colleges and universities are producing teachers who can teach under KERA
- (4) Work study programs in our schools will enhance voctaitonal education for otherwise bright students who do not perform well in traditional course curricula.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Katie Cline news director and co-host on WKQQ radio in Lexington. She compared the announcers on the station to Mission Impossible characters and she thinks of herself as Barbara Baine. She sees her role as countering the male personality as she works opposite Cruiser. Katie walked us through one of her typical days at the station and how she even has to rewrite AP stories. She comes on with the news at 6 AM. Her goal is to interject the female point of view. Her duties included working with law enforcement officers during last winter's snow storm. She spoke about various celebrities she has interviewed including Vice President Quayle. Other notable interviewees included the rock star "Sting" and Loretta Swit of MASH fame. She enjoys being the co-host of Lexington's No. One classic rock station. She jokingly said she is one of the nation's few female news directors and co-hosts who do not own the station. Last year, WKQQ won five AP broadcasting awards. Katie won four awards including a story called "Streets of Lexington" about AIDS volunteers. Other awards wre for stories on domestic abuse, Mothers' Day and Lt. Governor Paul Patton's trip to Japan. The Fall ratings for the station were excellent which enjoys 94000 listeners per week. WKOO has a wide spectrum of listeners many with high incomes. The station has the highest ratings of any Lexington station from 6 AM till midnight. There is also a high range of ages who listen. She gave four reasons for the success of WKOO. (1) Good promotions (2) Appealing programs with the kind of music people like to hear (3) A commitment to the news (4) Strong personalities.

Working for a radio is spontaneous and a challenge. Each da is different and you never know what will happen next like the earthquake in Japan. Statisics indicate there are 5 and 1/2 radioes per person. The average listener listens to the radio three hours each day and 98% listen for the news. There are many different personalities but you must be circumspect to not show it if you are having a bad day. The radio announcer must always be UP because that is what the listener wants to hear. In responding to questions from the floor, Katie made the following observations: (1) Although she has mixed feelings about the Connie Chung interview with Newt Gingrich's mother, if Connie said it was "just between you and" she should have kept it confidential. She would never use anything which was off the record. However, the call whether to use it would be hers and not the news director (2) She got her start on TV in Mason City, Iowa (3) She has no information about who will run for governor (4) She refers to herself and her colleagues as "motor mouths" who never run out of things to say. They are all about the same age and all the announcers can relate to the same things. She concluded her talk by saying all radio personalities have an ego and that spells success for a great radio station like WKQQ.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker was Dave Shuffett, host of "Kentucky Afield", one of KET's top rated shows, with over a million viewers. The show first aired in 1953 in Louisville, and is now the fourth longest running television show in America, after "Meet The Press, The "Today" Show, and "Guiding Light". One of his adventures involved learning that a white-tailed deer will try and kill you if given a chance -- while the cameras were rolling. Our own Hub Perdue will be a fishing guest on the show this spring. One of his recent guests was 104 years old, and state that his longevity was based on chewing tobacco, and going fishing every single day for the past 101 straight years! During Q&A we found out that there are now some 500 bears in Eastern Kentucky, and that every single county in the state has coyotes. A new 13,000 square foot interpretive education center will open this fall at the game farm. Over the next several years, the Elkhorn will return to being one of the best small-mouth bass streams in the world. This should help local tourism.
