THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speakers for the day were Bill Miller, Barry Holder, Sr. and John Schaaf who kicked off February as Rotary World Understanding month. Barry stated that the United Nations concept actually began in 1940 although the UN Charter was not signed until 1945 in San Francisco. The first conference was actually held in Havanna, Cuba and and then in London in 1943 where Rotary expressed an interest in cultural exchanges. This led to the creation of UNESCO and was the forerunner of Rotary's Group Study Exchange. Rotarians were instrumental in drafting the first Charter. A former vice president of Rotary International was the first President of the UN General Assembly. Barry then showed a tape entitled Rotary and the UN: 1945 and Today. The tape started out with a speech by President Truman inagurating the UN. In the first ten years, the Rotarian carried 75 articles on the UN. The UN is involved in much more than peacekeeping which consists of only about 15% of the budget. Other areas involve drug abuse, illiteracy, pollution, and sickness and hunger like the Polio-Plus campaign. The tape concluded with an address by RI President Bill Huntley who announced plans to celebrate the 50th anniversary in San Francisco. Discussion at the conference will center around goals and opportunities for future cooperation between Rotary and the UN.

The next speaker was John Schaaf, president of the Frankfort Chapter of the United Nations Association. He spoke of a commonality of goals between Rotary and UN including education, adv-

ocacy, and participation. Concerning education, this is done through UNA programs, child labor and work place safety which are common concerns of Rotary and UN. The UNA does not give blind support to the UN but provides objective criticism and dissent is invited.

As to advocacy and participation, UNA encourages the State Dept. to actively Participate in the UN. There is a need to communicate with members of Congress to support UN programs. Specific activities upcoming at UNA include a World View conference with the UK Patterson School of Diplomacy and an Editors Seminar. A program is planned in conjunction with the Frankfort Arts Foundation with a concert by the Louisville Orchestra this October as a UNA fundraising event. Former Attorney General Elliott Richardson is a possible speaker for the F.A.F. 1995-96 season. Finally, UNA will sponsor an essay contest for local high school students.

#### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Rotarian Bill Miller brought two speakers February 15, both of whom related not only to the cultural attainments of Kentucky State University, but also to African American History Month, which is February. First came James Joseph Gordon, an assisitant professor of history at KSU, who described the operations of the Center of Excellence for the Study of Kentucky African Americans(CESKAA). Mr. Gordon described the development of the Center under the leadership of President Mary Smith of KSU. He said the Center is a repository of materials which it collects and makes available on may levels. For one thing, it solicits family and genealogical information from African American farmilies in Kentucky. The Center also has done exhibits of its holdings, and has an ongoing project with students of Second Street School in Frankfort. Mr. Gordon also said the Center aims to preserve the heritage of African Americans in this state and eventually for the use of the National Preservation Trust at the national level. Mr. Gordon paid special tribute to David Weller who has been supportive of the Center through corporate funding. He referred also to Dr. Richard Taylor who has been active in campus support of the Center. Mr. Gordon said KSU is active in the Forefront of communicating about the values of diversity in our culture in general, and of Kentucky State in specif.

Mr. Thomas McPartland, a scholar in philosophy and history, is the acting dean of the Whitney Young Scholars Program, which he said was modeled on the great books approach of the great private schools of the Northeast. McPart-

land said the faculty of the honors program is trained in the interdisciplinary approach. He also said it has been essential to emphasize an international studies program as part of the interdisciplinary honors curriculum. KSU now is involved in a program of study abroad which began with Great Britain, but may expand to the Caribbean and Africa. This for FEBRUARY 15th is part of an International Studies Program which has resulted in a minor consisting of 21 hours credit. Students take a few required courses, and then construct their programs by selecting from an extensive list of 50 or more approved courses. The International Studies Program features student exchanges and faculty involvement abroad. Mr. McPartland explained at length how vital it has become for students to form an international approach to learning and to shaping career preparation for a life and career that depends upon their grasp of international ramificaitons which affect the entire scope of their futures.


